A giant among God's people has departed this world for the land that is fairer than the most beautiful spring day. Donald Phillips Roberts, 99, passed into God's eternity asleep beside Lane in the wee hours of Thursday morning, March 19th, 2020. Coincidentally, the first day of an early Spring this year.

Don, as known to his friends, was the youngest of four boys, born in Bedford County Tennessee on October 20th, 1920 to Emma S. and E. Gould

Roberts. He was born as the 1918 "Spanish Flu" pandemic ended and passed as the 2020 Coronavirus pandemic began, but he missed neither the Great Depression nor WWII.

Don was preceded in death by his son Donald Phillip Roberts. He is survived by his wife of 77+ years, Hillery Lane Walker

Roberts; his daughter Martha Ray Roberts Haselden and Jeff; his daughter-in-Law Eileen Dahlrumple Roberts; and his son Hilary Ernest Roberts and Carol. Don and Lane have seven grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

Don and Lane lived in Wartrace, Pinebluff, Chattanooga, Pittsburg, Nashville, Brentwood, and Huntsville. The majority of their married life they

were members of the Franklin Road Church of Christ which relocated to become the Woodland Hills Church of Christ, both in Nashville. Don served as an Elder for both congregations. Most recently Don and Lane were members of the Weatherly Heights church of Christ in Huntsville.

Don and Lane both attended church faithfully every week up until the 2019 virus pandemic struck, sitting together in their pew at Weatherly for the

> last few months. Wednesday, the 18th, Dad had a better than usual day, pushed mom in her wheelchair back from the dining room to their apartment, and dressed himself for bed. He crossed over around midnight at peace in his sleep.
