One of Paul's purposes in writing 2 Corinthians was to help those brethren prepare the contribution they had promised for the needy saints in Judea. Toward that end he sent Titus to assist them further. Along with Titus, Paul also sent "the brother whose fame in the things of the gospel has spread throughout the churches," 2 Corinthians 8:18.

A famous brother. Many think it was Luke. He certainly fits all the criteria of this text and the accompanying history in Acts. Whoever it was, it was to his credit that his fame was in the gospel: his knowledge of it, his work in it, etc.

In our day we still have brethren who are highly regarded for their Bible knowledge. Others have a broad reputation for generosity. Still others are known for hospitality.

On the other hand, a few brethren are fa-

mous for other things. Some are known mostly for contentiousness; trouble seems to follow wherever they go. Some have reputations as hobby-riders; they seem to be all about one pet subject. Some are reputed for their conceit or selfwill. Others have strong reputations for being weak when it comes to taking a stand on issues.

Few of us are known by brethren far and wide, but we are known at home. In whatever sphere it is, if a brother observed that you were famous for something, what would it be? \Box

Modeling Spiritual Success What Can Mothers Do to Help Their Children Go to Heaven?

rue success in life is properly measured solely upon the eternal destination of the soul. If the soul is lost the richest most successful men fail and the devil wins — "For what profit is it to a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul?" Matthew 26:16. Success for a parent will, in part, be based upon whether or not their children also go to heaven. This does not negate the reminder of Ezekiel: "The soul who sins shall die. The son shall not bear the guilt of the father, nor the father bear the guilt of the son. The righteousness of the righteous shall be upon himself, and the wickedness of the wicked shall be upon himself," Ezekiel 18:20. But, the desire of every Christian mother is see her children reach heaven. Consider some things that a mother can do to improve the odds of success.

PUT GOD FIRST

One cannot promote spiritual success if God is not sovereign in their own life. This is the basis upon which all spiritual blessings are offered, Matthew 6:33. Motherhood should begin by giving God the highest priority, Matthew 12:30. Children know. They are watching and will see firsthand what is most important. If they observe their parents attempting to serve both God and physical things, promote a mixed message that in the end says, "Do as I say and not as I do!" cf. Matthew 6:24. Children will model the life they see lived.

LOVE YOUR HUSBAND

Children need to know that their mother loves her husband, Titus 2:4. Much of what they will seek in their own relationships will be heavily based upon what they see at home. When they see their parents in conflict, it tends to profoundly impact their understanding of marriage and the home. Demonstrate love before them.

LOVE YOUR CHILDREN

It seems counterintuitive that a mother would need to be told to love her children, Titus 2:4. But Paul commanded that it be taught and practiced. Societies then to extremes. Some have conditioned people to be selfish of their own needs. Children are property to be exploited. Others have worshipped them as little gods that are to be worshipped. Christians live under the divine standard, not cultural normatives. Faithful mothers not only care physically for their children, but also nurture, discipline and structure lives that are balanced and pleasing to the Lord. Children are not meant to be their mother's BFF. "You are their mother, not a friend!"

PRAY WITH CHILDREN

Children need to see and hear the healthy prayer life. They need to see their fathers and mothers pray together with them. Children need to hear their parents pray for them. Pray for them in private, too. "The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous [father, mother] avails much," James 5:16.

LOVE GOING TO WORSHIP

Both mothers and fathers must model a love for worship for their children. It is a tangible manifestation of personal commitment to God. Children see that their faithful parents' desire to go to heaven supersedes every other aspect of life. They both see and hear whether or not their parents love God's people. They will model respect for local church leadership and the desire to serve others in the church only if they see it firsthand. Faithfulness in assembling together with the saints is essential in homes where going to heaven is the goal. Children grow to understand the importance of Bible class, worship and fellowship with the saints by first seeing it modeled by their parents.

TEACH THE WORD

Bible classes are supplemental. While they receive supplemental instruction in God's Word in the local church, and build relationships with other Christians of all ages by "going to church," it is only a small portion of their spiritual education. It begins and ends at home. Too many entrust the entire biblical education of children to Bible classes. Moses told Israel "YOU shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up," Deuteronomy 6:7. The sad fact is the Israelite people failed to do this and it lead to their demise. Sadder yet is that many have not taken Israel's error to heart.

While a mother cannot guarantee the spiritual success of her children, she is a child's first teacher. She becomes the model. At some point every child must "be fully persuaded in their own mind," Romans 14:5, 10-12. But, children whose faithful mother and father have displayed heaven as a realizable goal have been given the greatest advantage one can receive. Paul said, "Take heed to yourself and to the doctrine. Continue in them, for in doing this you will save both yourself and those who hear you," 1 Timothy 4:16.

Today is Mother's Day. We give honor to our own faithful mothers on this day. Let's all ask, "Am I doing what I need to do to help my children go to heaven?"
