Whenever It Breaks

An old monastery stands in Europe perched high on a cliff, several hundred feet in the air. The only way to reach the monastery is to be suspended in a basket which is pulled to the top by several monks who pull and tug with all their strength. Obviously the ride up the steep cliff in that basket is terrifying.

One tourist got exceedingly nervous about half-way up as he noticed that the rope by which he was suspended was old and frayed. With a trembling voice he asked the monk who was riding with him in the basket how often they changed the rope. The monk thought for a moment and answered serenely: "Whenever it breaks," Humor for All Occasions, 94.

It's shocking that someone would wait that long before changing the rope. It only makes sense that the rope ought to be changed long before reaching that point. But doesn't God operates the same way in our lives? If we were to ask God when His word is empowered to

change our lives, His answer might well be, "Whenever you break!"

You see, our lives can only change once we have what the Bible refers to as a "broken spirit." As long as we remain arrogant and determined to do things our way, God can't shape us and mold us. Like a wild stallion, we remain useless until we are "broken." "The LORD is near to those who have a broken heart, and saves such as have a contrite spirit," Psalm 34:18.

We tend to want to stubbornly do things our own way. Christ told His disciples that life in Him begins when and only when we are willing to "deny self." Essentially the child of God must submit to the Christ as Lord, ruler, of life. He must guide. He must lead. He must direct.

Making Christ King of our life begins with a "broken spirit," a "contrite heart." Our shortcomings are many. Humbly listening has not been our norm. Submit to Him now.

ehind every counterfeit is there not an authentic original? Thus, at back of the multiplicity of popular churches of modern "Christendom" there is the one, true "church of the living God." Back beyond all of the corruptions of men and time there is a single divine original from which they have by digression come.

It may seem bold to assert that modern denominationalism is the progeny of the fallible wisdom of mortal men. May we ask, "Is there any other conclusion that can be drawn?" Unequivocally the church of the New Testament in stark contrast to the former is the product of the infinite, infallible, ineffable wisdom of an eternal God of the universe. Paul penned the following concerning the church of our Lord to the brethren in Ephesus: "...To the intent that now unto the principalities and powers in heavenly places might be known by the church the manifold wisdom of God, according to the eternal purpose which he purposed in Christ Jesus our Lord," Ephesians 3:10-11, KIV.

Two thoughts should be emphasized from Paul's inspired statement relative to our topic: First, the church of our Lord was an integral part of God's eternal purpose with reference to the redemption and ultimate glorification of man. It was not as some contend a "spiritual contingent" made necessary by the unbelief and rejection of Christ by infidel Jews. Second, the church of our Lord exists as a living witness to the infinite, eternal wis-

dom of Jehovah. It is, therefore, in all of its attributes a product of Heavenly wisdom. It is divine in name, doctrine, worship, mission and organization. Each of these is a product of the infinite wisdom of an omniscient God. The multiplicity of religious denominations which characterize modern "Christendom" have grown out of a dissatisfaction on man's part with the church as fashioned by the wisdom of the eternal architect and a digression from his original blueprint. Their very existence constitutes a challenge to and a repudiation of the wisdom of God. To lay unholy hands upon "God's building," 1 Corinthians 3:9, to alter it by addition, subtraction or substitution is to be guilty of presumption and rebellion. It is to rob God of his glory.

It is axiomatic that whatever God institutes for specific purposes is wholly adequate for the accomplishment of those purposes. Infinite wisdom does not produce inadequate results. Whatever, therefore is divine, a product of divine wisdom, is also all-sufficient. Divinity and all-sufficiency are inseparable attributes. We do not need "a twenty-first century church for an aerodynamic, worldwide web generation." Were the church the product of human genius a revised streamlined church would be in order. Born of divine wisdom, the church of our Lord is perfect in conception and design. What the world needs is the restoration of a first century church to a twenty-first century people.
