God's Unchanging Promises

"So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of his purpose, he guaranteed it with an oath, so that by two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible for God to lie, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to hold fast to the hope set before us. We have this as a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul, a hope that enters into the inner place behind the curtain, where Jesus has gone as a forerunner on our behalf, having become a high priest forever after the order of Melchizedek."

Hebrews 6:17-20

en sometimes fail to keep their word. Though it may seem to happen more often than not, as a general rule it is the exception rather than the rule. Several childhood experiences, on which I will reserve commentary, taught me to be prepared for the consequences that not all MEN keep their word. But, God always keeps His word; in that we trust and rejoice.

Every promise of God is, like himself, absolutely unchangeable. Hebrews 6:17-20 is a powerful treatise on this assurance, and the hope that God's people have in His unchanging nature and the anchor to which the faithful cling.

The phrase translated "unchangeable" in the ESV is sometimes rendered "immutable," as in the KJV. The Hebrew writer related that God does two utterly immutable things in the issue of His promised blessing of those who preserve in hope after the fashion of Abraham. He speaks it! And then, He confirms it with an oath, swearing by His own unchangeable nature.

In His word and His oath, men, who live like refugees in a dying world, find strength. Abraham did; we do! We find hope only in Him. Abraham did; we do!

Hope for the child of God in any age, is his essential anchor, to which he or she clings. That anchor is reliable because the place at which it is affixed is reliable — the very presence of God.

Three words are appropriately highlighted in this context. First, anchor, Greek agkyra, or "safeguard" an emblem of hope in the first century world. The hope of the faithful is our safeguard, because it is fastened in the presence of an immutable God. Second, "sure," Greek asphales, "firm." People in an advanced nation see the word "asphalt" in the word, as we rely upon pavement as a sure footing for our automobiles. The term suggests a certainty of our hope in God's word and oath. Third, "steadfast," Greek bebaios, "trusty or unshaken." Taken together these three words suggest our hope is thrown upward beyond the celestial waters and has found its trusted ground beyond the veil, Milligan 235.

Jesus, as "High Priest forever after the order of Melchizedek" has become the forerunner of the faithful, affixing the anchor. In so doing He has become superior to all others who served as High Priests on earth. Ultimately and finally, Jesus has fixed the hope of Abraham and his seed in heaven. Christians are benefactors of God's unchanging promises.
