

Attitudes

Attitudes are the way we think or feel toward something or someone. Our attitudes are usually an emotional response to a particular situation. Like every airplane must have an attitude indicator that reveals to the pilot the relationship of the plane to the horizon, man must rely upon God's Word, or revelation, to show him where he is in relationship to God at any given time.

Some think that we can't control attitudes. James 5 teaches that our attitude is crucial and reveals three ways that God instructs us to adjust our attitudes. With God's help, wrong attitudes can be changed into right attitudes, just as a pilot can add or take away pressure against the controls to adjust the attitude of a plane. The failure to make those adjustments could be fatal. The same is true when it comes to adjustments in spiritual life. James demonstrates how to make the right choice to have godly attitudes, thus preparing for the coming of the Lord.

BE GENEROUS

James begins chapter 5 by warning Christians who are wealthy and put their trust in wealth, 3-5. The Lord's brother isn't condemning wealth, but its misuse and its power to erode devotion to God and the love of people. An attitude of faith allows us to give to God and others, believing that God will provide for us as well. We must not put our trust in our money.

BE PATIENT

The Lord is coming. Living impatiently denies God His rightful place of authority in the life of the child of God. James reminds readers that the farmer waits on God, so must we, 7-11.

BE TRUSTING

James says, "Pray!" "Sing Praise!" And "Call" for His leaders and servants in times of illness and distress, 13-20. Depend on the Lord by seeking Him. By adjusting our attitudes, it positions us both to be blessed and to be a blessing. □

o we have absolute standards that we all accept in our daily secular lives? Here is an offensive question! How much do you weigh? How do you know? This is the one I don't especially like to hear. How tall are you? We ask our children, "Who told you that?" Let me ask another. How many inches in a foot? Who says so? How many minutes in an hour? What determines the answer? How long is a yard? What if I were "broad-minded" enough to claim that there were 37 inches in a yard? How would you instruct me more perfectly?

In truth we all accept absolute standards in our physical lives. If one was sick with the COVID virus, would he go to an automobile mechanic? If one wanted to build a house, would he go to the druggist? If one had a TV "on the blink," would he take it to a dentist? If we did these things we would be considered slightly beside ourselves.

We recognize that there are specialized fields of training. A man who is an authority on the care, cleaning, filling, and fitting of teeth is not the individual to whom we should take our dirty carburetors! And the auto mechanic is not going to do too much good for that sore back we might have. Granted, he might flatten out our pocket-books somewhat, but he can do little for our physical well-being.

Why then, in religion, does not man consult the proper authority? Why do we lose

common sense, and say that "it makes no difference what you believe, just so you are sincere?" Sincerity and honesty are essential, but they alone are not enough, *2 Samuel 6:6-8*

We would be terribly confused if someone switched all the labels on our medicine bottles and household cleaning fluids and canned goods. We wouldn't know, from the label, whether we were taking an aspirin or a rat poison tablet. Let me suggest this is what the devil has done. He has switched all the labels in religion. He has made many counterfeits. The devil could not keep Jesus from building His church, *Matthew 16:18*, so he did the next best thing — He enticed men to make counterfeit churches. Consequently, people are confused. They do not know what to believe, or where to turn.

Those of us who have responded to the grace of God by gospel obedience and reciprocal love, need to help the lost find the way of eternal safety. We are not the authority, but we do know who is! Jesus says of Himself: "All authority hath been given unto me in heaven and on earth I am the way, and the truth, and the life: no one cometh unto the Father, but by me," Matthew 28:18; John 14:6. Therefore, let us consider every doctrine, claim, belief, or practice in religion under the lamp of the infallible standard of the Word of Christ. And, may our honest attitude of heart say and live by the sentiment: not my will, but Your will be done in all things. Our eternal home may rest in the balance. \Box
