MANTINE LUCILE AURORE DUPIN, best known by her pseudonym George Sand, was a 19th Century French Novelist and avowed Socialist. She is well known as the source of the following quotation that is the impulse of this article —

"Guard well within yourself that treasure, kindness. Know how to give without hesitation, how to lose without regret, how to acquire without meanness. Know how to replace in your heart, by happiness of those you love, the happiness that may be wanting in yourself."

Sands' literary assignment to her readers is a good one. How much of life that is infinitely good is missed because of a lack "kindness."

The bitter, disillusioned, sour person is invariably a selfish one. Such persons become so wrapped up in self that they are blinded to all of the sources of pure joy that abound in the

world around them. Bereft of someone to love or robbed of financial means, personal ambition stymied by unavoidable circumstances, such people often take refuge in the black cloud of gloom and self-pity. Their world is dark and unfulfilling.

If these persons could for a moment forget self and rejoice in the happiness and success of others, they would find a back door to happiness that is both ajar and welcoming of those who are willing to enter. Paul said, "Rejoice with those with those who rejoice," Romans 12:15.

Paul once sought to encourage a profound lesson of Jesus to leaders of the people of God: "In all things I have shown you that by working hard in this way we must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive," *Acts 20:35*. Only when we learn "to give without hesitation... to lose without regret," will kindness breathe its new life into us.

Race to the Finish

he 12th chapter of the Bible book of Hebrews begins the last series of exhortations from the writer intended to arrest the defection of Christians back to Judaism. The author employs the first and most well known image of a great coliseum with a vast numberless host looking on as Christians on earth compete in the human race. Imagine in the minds eye all the saved of the ages peering forward on the edge of their eternal seats as the faithful on earth compete for the prize of the heavenly call.

The word picture is clearly that. It not a literal matter. Any attempt to Biblically establish this as a literal experience would be futile. No Scripture sustains such claim. But figuratively, could the faithful gaze upon us as we compete for the heavenly prize, surely it would be exactly like this. If you need proof that it is literary imagery, simply note that if "the race set before us" is a metaphor, then necessarily, the audience is correspondingly representative.

Picture the beginning of the child of God's competition — "Lay aside every weight," evokes the image of a runner disrobing of his bulky outer garments which serve to encumber and burden him. The language suggests this in addition to sins that always impede. Begin by "putting off" sin, that skillfully surrounds as though purposefully placed to retard the runner, and anything else that hampers, 1.

The race begins but much effort is expended as it is prolonged, mirroring life as a Christian competitor — "Let us run with

endurance" is a pleading to spend one's total strength not swerved from his deliberate purpose, nor from his loyalty to the faith. Be ready to run as long as required.

The finish comes into view as life's race is rounds the last turn — "Looking to Jesus" stands as the superlative motivator for crossing the finish. It is the image of the crucified Jesus peering on from behind the finish line, cheering His followers. He is described as the "founder and perfecter of our faith" 2. As "founder," Gk. archegos "chief leader or prince," Jesus has taken the lead and is the example; as "perfecter," Gk. teleiotes, the "one who has in his own person raised faith to perfection." Thus, Jesus is our leader and our example. Run toward Him!

Christians are chastened to emulate Jesus. The "joy" of redeeming mankind was His motivator. It gave Him reason to "endure the cross," "despising," think little or nothing of, the shame of it. Now He sits at God's right hand and cheers His brethren in their own race to the finish.

Where is the strength discovered to finish strong? Its found in the manner of the Savior's own race. If Jesus bore such suffering and endured, God's people can too — "Consider Him," 3. "You have not shed blood,"4. You still have life, RUN!

Do not faint or grow weary. He is cheering you on along with all of those who've gone before. What greater encouragement could be offered to the children of God as we race to the finish?
