Saul of Tarsus spent his life pursuing the law and Judaism — "circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrew; as to the law a Pharisee; as to zeal a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless," Philippians 3:5-6. Judaism was his life. This was what gave him meaning and significance. It was his gain, his fortune, his joy. Christ changed it all!

"But, whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. Indeed, I count everything as loss..." 7-8. In Christ, Paul considered his past spoiled produce - rubbish. He asserts four desires for which he was willing to give up every earthly aspiration and attainment, 9-11.

KNOWING CHRIST — Paul counted the opportunity to know Jesus above anything and everything else. In big read letters he wrote, "LOSS" over every accomplishment and every possession. Knowing Christ is the only thing that meant anything in this life. It meant finding true prominence (excellency, kjv) in this life

and the next. Knowing Jesus meant understanding the law of Moses. It meant grasping the eternal plan of God. Knowing Christ meant finding the forgiveness God offers to all men.

GAIN CHRIST — Giving up "all things" for "his sake" is required if Christ is to be gained. Paul happily left it all. The roadway toward God is littered with the valueless rubbish of those who walk with Jesus and Paul.

FOUND IN CHRIST — Being found "in him" became the singular aspirational goal of Paul, 8-9. While Paul lived blamelessly under the law, his righteousness was still suspect. No more. "In Christ" his faith is counted as righteousness by the God of Abraham.

RESURRECTION — Paul was willing not only to suffer, but also to die suffering in order to "attain the resurrection of the dead," 11. He says, "by any means possible." Paul showed us that when living with Christ is the only thing of value or importance, "rejoicing in the Lord" is the result come what may! \Box

These dispositions result from many things: rearing, custom or tradition, popularity of the thing in question, innate personality traits etc. The cause may differ with different individuals, and whatever the cause the practical result in the same, but we all have predispositions. This fact should cause every man who desires to spend eternity with God to reexamine the spiritual ground on which he stands. Am I what I am and do I believe and practice that which I believe and practice because they are right and true, or because they are what I want to be right

ed God as saying to the wicked: "These things hast thou done, and I kept silence; thou thoughtest that I was altogether such a one as thyself . ." Psalm 50:21. Do we worship and serve God as He is revealed to us in His word? Or, do we worship and serve Him is we desire Him to be?

Frances Bacon wrote: "What a man had rather were true he more readily believes. Therefore he rejects difficult things from impatience of research; sober things, because they narrow hope; the deeper things of nature, from superstition; the light of experience, from arrogance and pride, lest his mind should seem to be occupied with things mean and transitory: things not commonly believed, out of deference to the opinion of the vulgar. Numberless in short are the wars, and sometimes imperceptible, in which affections color and infect the understanding." (Novum Organum via Logic and Language.)

Jesus impressively taught in the "Parable of the Sower" that the "good seed" — "the word of God" — takes root and grows to fruition only in the "good and honest heart," Luke 8:11-15. The more strongly therefore we desire to believe a thing, the more carefully we should guard against being deceived by our own predisposition! 🗖

When Samuel told Saul that his throne would be taken from him due to his disobedience he said.
