"Cooling" Spirituality

it possible for one to lose their salva-C tion? The Hebrew writer said, "YES!" L U Hebrews 3:12. How does that fall begin? It doesn't happen overnight. It begins with an almost undetectable cooling of spiritual passion. It progresses as one grows cold toward the Lord. Finally, all excitement for Christ, salvation and heaven are squelched entirely.

The Hebrew writer intended to stem the tide of digression among Jewish Christians whose faith had become weak. He warned of the dangers of cooling spirituality. He wrote to fan the flames of their faith. "Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need," Hebrews 4:16.

"Cooling" spirituality may happen to any Christian. It may begin with tragedy or disappointment diverting one's attention. Rather than crying out to the Lord, finding shelter in Him, the believer slowly ceases reading the Bible.

The flames of faith begin to burn low. As less time is spent growing in faith, the Christian's relationship with God is affected: church attendance diminishes, giving becomes sporadic, prayer is stale; God is only needed in emergencies.

No longer willing to stand up for what he once deemed important, the Christian soon is found compromising in virtually every aspect of common life. He may feel plagued by guilt. He may be defensive about the way he is living. In short order the joy, contentment, and peace from God are replaced by fear, worry and doubt.

A Christian who allows himself to drift away will miss out on the joy and fulfillment of a rich relationship with the Lord. If his course remains uncorrected, he will miss heaven altogether.

Is your excitement about the things of God stronger than ever? Or, has it diminished? Are you growing cold? If your faith needs stoking, get to it. Come home to Christ! Warm UP!
