Every Christian has those times when we feel as though something is missing. It's easy to fall into that "Why isn't God blessing me?" mode. After all, isn't hardship part of life? We can't have everything for which we ask, can we? Such a foolish spirit could in fact hinder us from appreciating some of the good things the Lord has in mind to give us. We must think before we act.

Consider Esau. He was hungry when he returned from doing what he loved, hunting. Jacob, his younger twin brother, offered him a bowl of red lentils in exchange for Esau's birthright. In haste, without thinking, Esau, accepted his brother's offered. For all of human history this example is used to illustrate the vanity of acting out of lustful haste. He didn't really think.

We are all prone to ask, "Why would Esau make such a swap?" Yet, if we are honest with ourselves, we all have acted with "spiritual shortsightedness." We often give up what is excellent for a moment of temporary self-satisfaction.

You may recognize these characteristics. We sometimes make decisions based on today, without considering the consequences of tomorrow. We sometimes assign higher priority to appetites and emotions than to the things of God. We sometimes sacrifice what is lasting for something that brings only fleeting satisfaction. We, too often, focus on the temporal, rather than the eternal. We make decisions in a moment of physical, emotional, or spiritual weakness. We don't think!

It's almost comical that we see all of this in Esau's callous act, but refuse its application to our own vain impetuous decisions. It may in the moment be desirable to base a decision upon an immediate selfish desire, but are you willing to pay the price for that kind of shortsightedness? It will never satisfy your heart. Think before you act!
