
The writer of Hebrews refers to Jesus as our High Priest. Each year the man serving in this capacity would enter the Holy of Holies, and

The centerpiece of my intellectual universe is Biblical primitivism, a search for the first pure truths and ordinances. I am seeking that elusive image of Christianity as it came from the mind of God.

You may say it is not there; it is an illusion. I have decided to seek it anyway. We live a in a world of illusions. You say I will not find it because I carry on my back the baggage of my own past, of the culture in which I live, of the language with which I think. Self-consciously and with as much self-awareness as possible, I have decided to try.

You may say I will fail and be disillusioned. So far I have not. In a sense, all restorers are seekers though sometimes we may think otherwise. Yet I will not become cynical or despairing because all truths are not readily apparent. But rather I am joyous and thankful that we have come this far by faith. To be a restorer has always meant to be an explorer in search of Zion bound to grope in our own human and cultural maze. Never finishing our task, but ever learning through struggle and commitment to the truth. But I have never been alone. God has provided others of like mind to be my fellow travelers.

It has been a rigorous journey, but I know exis-

tentially no other way. The search has served me well and should you come to look for me, you will find me a bit further down the same road.

Editor's note: I am including this piece in tribute to a stalwart voice in the kingdom of God for more than six decades. "Ed" Harrell at this printing is nearing the end of his earthly life and is anticipating his heavenly reward. Ed Harrell is a Christian, a preacher and an American historian who is best known for his scholarship of Religion in the United States. He is a Professor Emeritus at Auburn University, where he served as the Breeden Eminent Scholar of Southern History and retired in 2006. Brother Harrell has written biographies of Oral Roberts, Pat Robertson, and Homer Hailey, as well as other works about Pentecostalism and the Charismatic movement. In 2006, he published Unto a Good Land: A History of the American People, a college textbook that discusses the effects of religion in the history of the United States.

According to my friend and brother Steve Wolfgang this piece was originally an extemporaneous speech at the end of an academic conference in 1985 which brought the audience, which had been pindrop quiet, to its feet with applause. Ed repeated it over the years in various venues, and it still inspires.

How do you respond to hostility toward your "Christian" belief? If you have not confronted cultural challenges, be assured that you will, sooner rather than later.

Be willing to suffer or be misunderstood. Don't fear the intimidation, but remember that when you are persecuted, you are blessed, Matthew 5:10.

Sanctify the Lord in your heart. Followers of Christ are no longer enslaved to the world but slaves to Christ and His righteousness, Rom 6:18; 1 Cor 7:22.

Always be ready to give a defense for your hope; gently and respectfully — never with anger.

Keep a good conscience. You can't foresee how God may use your example. Perhaps your righteous behavior and words will influence others to see their own sin and turn to Christ.
