A political strategist came under criticism a few years ago for disparaging the wife of an opposing candidate, who was a stay-at-home-mom. The strategist, a woman, derided, "actually she's never worked a day in her life." This wasn't the first, nor will it be the last, debate on the "job" of stay-at-home-moms in our country. Young women are constantly encouraged to prove their worth in the business world, and millions are. Many are doing quite well, too. There is no question that women are fully capable of succeeding in business, industry, politics, or whatever field they pursue. But while women are "proving" their worth in the cubicles and boardrooms, "who is raising the children?"

Sincerity Michael W. McLemore

In 1991 Clayton Nixon died of an untreated ear infection. His family lived in Holidaysburg, PA and were members of a religious sect known as Faith Tabernacle. The group rejected the need for medical intervention for illness. They relied solely upon prayer citing James 15:14-16 as Biblical authority for refusing medical treatment. Many were compelled to ask, "How could they allow something like that to happen to their child? Couldn't they see the child wasn't recovering?"

Six years later the Nixon family was back in the news. This time their daughter, Shannon, died from a lack of insulin for her diabetes. When she became ill, instead of calling a doctor, her parents called for her grandfather, Charles Nixon, who anointed her with oil and prayed over her. Even after she went into a coma, no medical treatment was sought. The District Attorney, recalled, "Even at the point of coma, this illness was treatable." Again, the question, "How could they?"

Many are heard to say, "It doesn't matter what you believe as long as you are sincere!" But, does sincerity count for more than what you believe? If what one believes is false, the results can be tragic. Sincerity alone will not gain salvation, neither is sincerity alone enough. Man must obey God and be sure what he believes is from God and not man!


