

"Ye Which are Spiritual"

How does one measure his or her spirituality? Perhaps it's maturity indicated by the way one acts. The immature behave in a childish fashion, so maybe this is it. But, isn't there more? To be spiritual would imply one would respond and be guided by and act with a spiritual attitude under varied circumstances.

Listen to Paul, "Brethren, if a man be overtaken in fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted," *Galatians 6:1*.

Two challenges sometimes arise in considering one's spiritual stature. First, the spiritual must refrain from thinking he is stronger than he really is. Second, one must refrain from wrong prevailing spirits, *ie.* arrogant rather than meek. To one degree or another — depending on the circumstance — Christians will face these challenges, trying or ordinary.

With regard to the first challenge, one should always bear in mind that temptation is not something about which he should be flippant. It is serious. As one attempts to help others, he must be humble enough to recognize that he is not always as strong as he might think. While trying to influence others toward godliness, one must keep up his guard lest he be influenced by the same temptation and trip.

The second challenge has a great deal to do with attitude. The spiritual must learn to hold firmly to God's truth, but not lose a grasp on the "divine motive" – love for the souls of men no matter how low they may have plunged. Extant gentleness must characterize one's tone and frame of mind as he interacts with the weak. When this is the case the attempt at restoration will draw the lost back to the Lord.

Jesus was amazed in his generation at "spiritual" arrogance. Sin is serious and restoration is for serious people. Jesus was clear about repentance, telling the sinner to "go and sin no more," *John 8:11*. But the Lord approached those in need of doing so with a spirit of compassion, gentleness and love.

This important work must always be approached with a Christ-like spirit of meekness. God wants us to be spiritual. It is for this we must constantly strive.

What a blessing we have in prayer!

Rarely does a week pass when members or their family or friends are not touched by some manner of difficulty or challenge.
