

FAITH & SALVATION

John 8:24. What many fail to understand is that there can be no salvation apart from the law of faith. "Where is boating then? It is excluded. By what law? Of works? Nay; but by the law of faith," Romans 3:27.

This raises two questions: First,

What is the law of faith? Second, When does it save? The answer to the first is, the law of faith is the "word of faith," Romans 10:8, which is the "gospel of peace," Romans 10:15 that was being preached by the apostles for the purpose of producing faith (Romans 10:17). The jailer's being told to believe and be saved, then their speaking "unto him the word of the Lord," Acts 16:3-34, proves that to believe one must hear the word that produces faith, which is the gospel, the law of faith.

The answer to number two is that one is saved by the law of faith when he receives and obeys it, Acts 2:37-41. Faith that works avails, Galatians 5:6. Faith alone is dead, James 2:17. So, the law of faith, gospel, saves when it is obeyed, 2 Thessalonians 1:6-9. 🗖
