IN WEAKNESS WE ARE STRONG

Christ was judged weak, un-empowered. But, men are no judges over what makes one strong: "For though he was crucified through weakness, yet he liveth by the power of God. For we also are weak in him, but we shall live with him by the power of God toward you," 2 Corinthians 13:4, KJV. "Out of weakness were made strong," affirmed the unnamed Hebrew writer, Hebrews 11:34. How were they made strong out of weakness? "Through faith," he explained. This entire concept escapes the "wisdom of this world."

The murderers who crucified Jesus were not defeating God. They were fulfilling His will, empowering His plan by shedding the redeeming blood. Though appraised weak by the world, the enduring soldier, the law-abiding runner, the fruitful farmer abide in the true grace and strength of God, 2 Timothy 2:1-6.

Grace is not earned by human strength. Who

has sufficient grounds or merit upon which to claim God's favor? His indulgence will not be earned by the strong by mounding good works on a scale, compensating for sin and wrong. That is not how one attains Divine favor. Grace is an extension of the Divine benefactor toward those who meekly and faithfully obey Him.

The power and equipment for the ministry of God's people are assured, *cf. Romans 1:5; 12:6*. In Paul's exhortation of Timothy as he dealt with looming spiritual warfare, or the certain trial of faith, all were but light afflictions when each relied on "the grace that is in Christ."

Surely, our beneficent Father will provide the faithful what is needed in the face of even the greatest adversity. In weakness we are strengthened. Paul said, put them in remembrance: "It is a faithful saying: For if we be dead with him, we shall also live with him: If we suffer, we shall also reign with him," 2 Timothy 2:11-12.

Leave Your Busy-ness

may sound shocking but all Christians are not effective evangelists. Some may glefully agree and say, "I'm sure not. May I be excused?" No, Sir! All Christians may not be effective evangelists, but we all have a role to play in evangelism. We are all a cord in God's net.

Bible readers may recall Jesus' great demonstration on the Sea of Galilee when He first called disciples to His word – "Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch," *Luke 5:4*. Simon responded, "Master, we toiled all night and took nothing!" 5.

Simon's response is not unlike our own. "I have tried, Lord, but I've had no success."

It is true. By our own power, we fall short of even our own expectations. Listen to Simon Peter's faith, "But at your word I will let down the nets!" He made the effort and Jesus did the rest — "And when they had done this, they enclosed a large number of fish, and their nets were breaking," 6.

Jesus can only use those who make themselves available to Him. Our greatest ability is our availability. In the context of Luke 5 many heard the Lord teach, 1. When the people pushed Jesus to the water's edge He improvised and asked nearby fishermen to take launch into the lake. Teaching required flexibility, 2. Challenges force teachers to adapt their method, 3. Jesus' involvement of other students led to greater opportunities.

They became invaluable partners in His task.

Jesus was not content to leave his partners in the shallows. He commanded, "Put out into the deep" for a deeper understanding. They had labored into the night but bore no fruit, But, when Jesus comes in futures are altered, 3. Launching into the deep might have seemed fruitless, 4. Jesus taught them that past experience is no measure of effectiveness, 5. Divine guidance always produces in abundance, 6. The work will become too much for a few. Other partners are needed, and they

will share the result, 7. When we've seen the end from the beginning, faith results, 8. It is strengthened at the sight of His divine power, 9.

Jesus dispelled fear.
He always changes
what we are concerned about into
what He is concerned
about, 10. Perhaps here
the greatest lesson of all is
observed in the disciple's response to Jesus – "And when they

had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed him," 11. True availability means leaving behind our busy-ness!

Jesus brought the disciples from doing little things to doing great things. It all began with a teacher improvising and partners becoming involved. You may not think yourself up to the task at hand. Leave behind your busy-ness and rely upon your greatest ability, availability! Jesus will take you and use you to greater things than you have ever seen. \square
