When it was time for me to leave we checked one last time and all three of the bees had been cleaned off enough to fly away and the container was empty.

Those three little bees lived because they were surrounded by family and friends who would not give up on them, family and friends who refused to let them drown in their own stickiness and resolved to help until the last little bee could be set free.

# **Burden Bearing**

aul charged, "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ," Galatians 6:2. This "burden" is a spiritual burden. This is suggested by the fact that Paul instructs those who are "spiritual" to help restore such a person. Once he has been restored and is in the process of turning from his sin, he needs the help of all of those who are in the spiritual body of Christ. Bearing the burden of spiritual oppression brought upon him by sin is no easy load. Such oppression separates one from others, and also from God. Paul calls for "help."

God does not want one to try to handle this kind of burden alone. Helping one bear this kind of burden by being forbearing toward him is something that all who are in the body can do and must do.

It is true that there is a "burden" that one must bear alone, 5. But this is a different kind of burden. Paul uses a different word for "burden" in this verse. This burden has to do with one's own work as a Christian. Every Christian must work out his own salvation, Phil. 2:12. Each person has his own work to do. Work that no one else can do for him, or help him do. But when it comes to the burden of sin that Paul is discussing in Galatians 6:2 God knows that brother must lean on brother. This is what fellowship in the body of Christ is all about.
