Christian family was heading to Lvyv. And I asked if they could take us with them. They agreed. Then I asked if they could take us to Slovakian border (I didn't hope to hear yes) but they agreed. So we've been driving the whole day from 9 a.m and made it to the border at 11ish p.m. to see that we're not gonna make it. Crowds of people were standing there without any particular order. And it just didn't seem possible to stand out there with gates closed, with two little kids in the cold. But God is still caring. And our brother in Christ lives near here, so I called him, he came and brought us to his apartment. A brother in Christ from Slovakia spent hours waiting to pick us up on that side. So close and yet so far. All in vain. Thankful for family in Christ, more than I could express now. We are not hurt, Slava is doing great, girls are behaving. Until yesterday we had wonderful time "traveling". But than they started to suspect something after I woke them up at 1 a.m. to get down to basement. Anyways, thankful for what we have. Everything could be much worse. Sasha had a hard day. All the day driving. At some point their wheel broke on the middle of nowhere, during the war. He is in the city we left with the girls this morning. Pray for God to save this country, to stop this madness. It is a funny feeling, like we have options and at the same time we don't.
