aniel was a righteous man who gained the trust of both the Babylonian and Persian kings by not compromising his belief in the one true God, *Daniel 6:8-28*. His fellow-captives Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego likewise rejected Nebuchadnezzar's command to bow to an idol despite his threat to cast them into the fiery furnace. Their steadfastness caused the despot to recognize Yahweh as the one true God, *Daniel 3:13-20*. The impact upon foreign kings was profound with generational consequences. The list is long of those who stood firm in belief and refused to waver in their commitment to the Lord, *cf. Genesis 39:1-9*.

Contrast the staunch faith of these devoted followers of God with the spineless approach of many today. Many think that the things people believe are based on circumstance and current situations. When those circumstances change, convictions are adjustable. Sadly, it isn't at all

unusual to find Christians who readily go back and forth on matters that require firm resolve.

Godly convictions and the faithful who hold-fast to them withstand the winds of opinions and lofty arguments of opponents, *1 Corinthians 10:1-6*. Unshakeable trust in God and His Word is what grounds the true believer. Now more than ever, God's people must confidently stand firm against beliefs and thoughts that threaten the church refusing to give space to unbelief.

The Lord has called you and me in our generation to stand firm for His truth. As a generation, we must never allow our enjoyment of life or the desire to be accepted by our peers to morph into an excuse for careless handling of God's truth. Our generation of peers needs Daniel's resolve in the face of dizzying circumstances. It needs to hear the words of the Babylonian captives: "be it known to you, O king, that we will not serve your gods," *Daniel 3:18.*

God that brings salvation has appeared to all men, teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly in the present age, looking for the blessed hope and glorious appearing of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, who gave Himself for us, that He might redeem us from every lawless deed and purify for Himself His own special people, zealous for good works," *Titus 2:11-14*.

Scriptures uses "Grace" in a number of ways. It can mean "that which God extends or gives to another," or it might be "an idiomatic expression meaning something different than the sum of its individual word definitions – a figure of speech." This is Paul's use of "grace" in Titus 2.

aul said, "For the grace of

Paul affirms that the gospel, the good news of God's salvation, was available to all men, both Jew and Gentile, in the first century. It cannot mean that every person on the face of the earth had received God's grace personally. The phrase "the grace of God" is used as an idiom. To further support this fact, notice what the text says the grace of God continues to do. Paul stated that the grace of God was "teaching us that,"

denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly in the present age..." God's grace teaches. This is consistent with the observation that "the grace of God" as used in Titus 2.11 refers to the "gospel system" that was operative in the lives and hearts of God's people at that time. The gospel, the product of God's favor toward man, grace, was substituted for its effect (i.e. teaching).

God's grace is absolutely essential to salvation. But so are some of the things that God's grace produces, e.g. the gospel. Man can no more be saved without the gospel than he can be saved without God's grace! Grace is essential as well as some of the effects of grace. Paul's expression should be understood to express these very facts. Grace is essential, the gospel is essential, teaching is essential, learning is essential, application of what one learns is essential. The "grace of God" stands at the head of the line in a list of essential things so far as salvation is concerned, for salvation itself is "God's gift," not earned, but appropriat-

Fellowship Michael W. McLemore

"Christian" fellowship requires mutual individual commitment. Beginning a relationship is easy; continuing in relationship is difficult. Paul acknowledged the "partnership" of the church at Philippi from the very first day, Philippians 1:5. He could've filled his letter with stories experiences they had overcome. He didn't. He knew that moments of trial and seasons of adversity require commitment, to God and to each other.

Working for decades in any local church is not easy. There are no enduring relationships without forgiveness. And that too requires commitment. The greater glory goes to Christ—not when we take our marbles and go home because something didn't work out the way we wanted it. The greater glory goes to the Lord when we pursue and persevere in relationships in spite of the shortcomings that we see in one another. It's not about you or about me. It's about growing in love together for the glory of God.

Consider four things that break down commitment and destroy fellowship: First, entitlement militates with fellowship; Second, superiority wrecks relationships. It says, "My opinion counts more!" Third, agendas divert focus from Christ's plan. Fourth, unforgiveness when injury occurs drives a wedge between God's people. Put them off!
