

The Greek word *spoude*, earnestness, appears four times in 2 Corinthians 7–8. Paul is exposing the deadly difference between godly grief over sin and ungodly grief. He contends that "Godly grief produces a repentance that leads to salvation without regret, whereas worldly grief produces death," *2 Corinthians 7:10*. He wanted the Corinthians to experience "godly grief," a repentant grief, grief that leads to salvation. Shallowness and self-centered sorrow benefits no one. "Earnestness" is the great essential.

He continued, "Although I wrote to you, it was not for the sake of the one who did the wrong, nor for the sake of the one who suffered the wrong, but in order that your earnestness for us might be revealed to you in the sight of God," 2 Corinthians 7:12. As God's people prepared to stand before Him, Paul says, "I want you to see your own earnestness." He wanted his letter to spark spiritual renewal, earnestness.

The desired awakening was seeded, not in gentil coddling of their sins, rather in the hard, pointed, forceful words from his pen. Rebuke is unpleasant. But, is it not the path to earnest renewal? The gift of God's Son compels a powerful invitation to return to spiritual sanity and life. It may be preferable to wallow in self-pity, but those who do will miss the invitation and forfeit the fire of earnestness.

Paul pointedly confronted the Corinthians. His first letter not only brought them to acknowledge their sin, and then repent, it consequently filled them with a fresh sobering sense of reality before God – "See what earnestness this godly grief has produced in you, but also what eagerness to clear yourselves, what indignation, what fear, what longing, what zeal," 2 Corinthians 7:11. Earnest conviction alone will give birth to a more serious devotion to God, and finally a more serious love for one another!

follow Christ, *Matthew 19:21-22*. The Lord's invitation to be His disciple means modifying our way of living. Switching jobs and altering habits, was common place for many of Jesus followers. Even now God is calling us to adapt to His plan.

Before Jesus' invitation to travel in His company, James and John worked in their family's business alongside their father. Accepting the call of Christ for them meant spending far less time with friends and relatives. Following Christ meant a change in their relationships. It is the same for us today.

The call of Christ changes our goals and it changes our relationships. But the eternal return on any sacrifice we make in service to Him, Christ assures, surpasses our ability to comprehend, *Matthew 19:29*.

Our Father's plans are based upon His mercy, justice and goodness. His perfect character assures that we can trust the path that He outlines for us. Melding to God's design by accepting His word and making the necessary changes in our lifestyles and relationships is always the course to choose—"Trust in the Lord will all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths," *Proverbs 3:5-6.*
