TODAY AT WEATHERLY



So Much More!

Paith is more than simple acceptance of testimony. It may be the beginning, but faith goes beyond, taking note or saying "I believe!" Faith finds its lodging in the heart of the hearer. Faith affects the life. Listen to Paul, when he wrote to the Thessalonians to tell them that Timothy was sent to, "establish you, and to comfort you concerning your faith," 1 Thessalonians 3:2. Note...

Paul knew they would suffer tribulations, and wanted to "learn about your faith, for fear that somehow the tempter had tempted you and our labor would be in vain," 5. If these Thessalonians had given ground, or drawn back, because of their trials, Paul would assign this to lacking faith. Timothy brought good tidings of their "faith and love," 6, so Paul was "comforted about you through your faith," He said, "For now we live, if you are standing fast in the Lord. For what thanksgiving can we return to God for you, for all the joy that we feel for your sake before our God," 8-9.

Faith needs constant improvement. Despite the comforting assurance of Timothy, Paul prayed "most earnestly night and day that we may see you face to face and supply what is lacking in your faith." 10. Great faith is needed for such things as forgiveness of one who repeatedly wrongs us, and repeatedly asks forgiveness. In such a case even the apostles asked, "Lord, increase our faith," Luke 17:3-5. It's so much more!
