

"In that day their strong cities will be like the deserted places of the wooded heights and the hilltops, which they deserted because of the children of Israel, and there will be desolation. For you have forgotten the God of your salvation and have not remembered the Rock of your refuge..." *Isaiah 17:9-10*.

Did you know that most NFL players are broke or financially stressed after two years of retirement? (Sports Illustrated) How does someone go from being a millionaire to being broke in such a short amount of time? There are a multitude of reasons but what stands behind all of them is short-sidedness.

We wouldn't be as foolish, would we? We would wisely invest those millions of dollars. We wouldn't blow it all on the mansions, cars, clothes, and expensive jewelry. We would prepare for the future and retire responsibly and comfortably.

Jude's epistle was written early in the history of the church, before the last apostle died,

but already the members of that infant body had forgotten a truth once well known among them. Pointedly, Jude addresses a tendency on the part of brethren to forget truth which they had once known. May we ask, "If it could happen then, could it not happen now?"

And guess what? If we have done all of that and forgotten God, we are just as short-sided as those NFL players. Sure, we will have stretched out our wealth over decades instead of years, but there is no difference once we're dead!

Think about it! What's the difference? If all we've done is heaped up riches for ourselves and forgotten God, we'll be just like ancient Babylon (Ch. 13), Assyria (Ch. 14), Moab (Chs. 15-16), Syria (Ch. 17), & Israel (Ch. 17). Our destruction will be certain and our judgment will be just.

Father, teach us not to trust in uncertain riches but in you who give us richly all things to enjoy. Give us a mind to be rich in good works, ready to give and willing to share.

The Lord Saves & Destroys

"Now I want to remind you, although you once fully knew it, that Jesus, who saved a people out of the land of Egypt, afterward destroyed those who did not believe."

Jude 5

ne need look no further than the diminutive letter of Jude to see the possibility of apostasy on the part of people once saved by the blood of Jesus. Jude uses the experiences of the Israelites in their deliverance from Egypt and their subsequent misdemeanors to enforce this truth. He makes them typical of the sinner's deliverance from sin and the apostasy of Christians, or servants of the Lord. His emphasis is on the fact that the Israelites "once saved by the Lord" were not always saved, but were later "destroyed by the Lord" because they had lost their faith. The had become unbelievers.

Salvation by the Lord does not destroy man's free moral agency. God does not force the will of the saved man to keep him saved. He can still believe or disbelieve. If he continues to be a believer in the full sense of that expression as it is used in the New Testament, he is secure. No power in earth or hell can touch him. If he surrenders his faith, becomes unfaithful, the same Lord who saved him will destroy him. Elsewhere throughout the New Testament God's children are admonished to faithfulness.

The popular doctrine of "the impossibil-

ity of apostasy" is a vicious illusion! Members of the church of the Lord are not supposed to believe such, but at times one wonders when he observes the negligence, unconcern, worldliness and digression from truth characteristic of many.

Christ is abundantly able to save, but some will not accept his proffered grace, mercy and salvation. They choose, being free to do so, to remain in sin and unbelief. Others, having once accepted the grace, mercy and salvation of the Lord, will not comply with the divine conditions of their continued enjoyment, faithfulness and obedience. The same Lord who saved is just as able to destroy! Jude's brother, James, says, "There is only one lawgiver and judge, he who is able to save and to destroy. But who are you to judge your neighbor?" 4:12.

We often sing, "He is able to deliver thee...." We can just as scripturally and truthfully sing, "He is able to destroy thee...." In the words of the poet, Longfellow,

"Let us then be up and doing, with a heart for any fate, still pursuing, still achieving—learn to labor and to wait."

This Week at Weatherly



Teaching the Bible Adapted
