he Airbus A320 was flying at 37,000 feet over the Denver, Colorado, area when it last made radio contact, the NTSB said. Northwest Flight 188 had departed San Diego enroute to Minneapolis-St. Paul International Airport carrying 144 passengers, two pilots and three flight attendants. Pilots with more than 11,000 and 20,000 hours of flight time respectively over shot their intended destination by more than 150 miles. The reason? They were distracted by the use of their personal laptops in the cockpit – prohibited devices during flight. The pilots lost focus; it could have been tragic.

Losing focus can have disastrous consequences for the child of God also. Danger is everywhere. But, on what should the children of God stay focused?

We are "FOLLOWERS" and following takes focus. Jesus said, "My sheep hear my voice... and they follow me," *John 10:27*. Paul exhorted, "Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ," *1 Corinthians 11:1*. The Greek word for "imitator" is

"mimetes." Paul is saying, "Mimic me as I am imitating Christ!" Imitating takes focus.

We are "DISCIPLES," and discipleship requires focus. Jesus charged, "go make disciples of all nations," then "teach them," *Matthew 28:19 -20*. Disciples are learners. They need a guide. God's word is a lamp for our feet and a light for our path, *Psalm 119:105*. Nothing else can do that. Learning God's word takes focus.

We are "SOJOURNERS." This world is not our home. The city of God is our home. Going to heaven requires constant focus. By faith Abraham "waited for the city which has foundations, whose builder and maker is God," *Hebrews 11:10*. Paul admonished Timothy in 2 Timothy 2:4, "No one engaged in warfare entangles himself with the affairs of this life, in order that he may please him who enlisted him as a soldier." Focus on the looming dangers of living in this life. It is a battle. Living the life of a sojourner takes focus. Satan wants only to distract Gods people. Don't allow him to succeed by losing your focus!

many ways our entire country has been turned upside down by the death of Mike Leach, head football coach of Mississippi State University. While many were aware of coach Leach's quirky nature and his profoundly innovative impact upon college football, most were not. Mike Leach was a phenomenal coach who changed the game forever. His loss will be felt deeply by the sport. Certainly, the death of Mike Leach is a tragedy for his family. They are reeling that his life has ended in a snap. Our collective prayers are for their comfort.

In the days since the passing of coach Leach, I have read and heard dozens of stories related by people who crossed paths with him over the years. Some knew him well. Others were perfect strangers. One story circulated on social media by WVTM 13 (Birmingham) anchor Rick Karle in my mind surpasses them all. This little story should be a lesson for everyone, but especially for every Christian.

Karle reported, "Jeff Tyler of Wetumpka, Alabama, contacted me to tell me a great story."

Tyler wrote, "Three years ago, I took my 11-year-old son to a Mississippi State game. Jackson wanted to see pregame warm-ups, so we were practically the first fans in the stadium.

"We took our upper-level seats, and my son asked if he could walk down to the field level seats to watch warm-ups, and I let him. This kid somehow managed to convince a security guard that he was supposed to be on the field. The next thing I saw was my son walking up to Coach Leach and fist bumping him.

"The two started talking, and a few minutes later Coach Leach called over a couple of his players. Jackson plays center on his YMCA football team. Within minutes coach Leach had his centers showing Jackson how to properly snap the football. I was in the upper deck, totally dumbfounded that the head football coach of an SEC team was spending time during pre-game warm-ups showing a boy that he had never met how to snap a football.



Jeff Tyler's story is far from over, and coach Mike Leach's lesson is even more profound.

"Two years later we went to another game. My son was again in the front row watching warm-ups. A graduate assistant ran over and yelled, 'Are you Jackson?' My son said, 'Yes!' The graduate assistant said, 'Coach Leach wants to see you,' and he took my son out on the field.

"Coach Leach asked my son if he'd been practicing, and then had him do several snaps. Coach told him to keep working on it, gave him a football and sent him on his way. I was in the stands once again dumbfounded that a coach remembered my son's name, remembered that day, and knew what spending five minutes of his time with a kid could mean."

This is my favorite Mike Leach moment; not his fast-paced offensive schemes or his quirky stories and quick-witted hilarious responses. It's the story of his teaching young Jackson Tyler of Wetumpka, Alabama the finer points of the game they both loved when he could've been doing what many view as much more important work. In a snap Mike Leach changed the life of a little boy — twice!

It all reminds me of the day another far more well-known man stopped what He was doing and showed His own tender care and love for children by laying His hands upon them, *Matthew 19:13-14*. The disciples of Jesus had rebuked their parents for wanting Jesus' attention for a moment to simply touch their children. In return Jesus rebuked His own disciples for not grasping both the gravity of that moment and the importance and value of children.

In a snap, Mississippi State football coach, Mike Leach, left this world for the next. He touched thousands of lives in this life, but none more profoundly than one little boy named Jackson Tyler from Wetumpka, Alabama. I hope Jackson's story and Mike Leach's lesson will change how we see those moments for us. Jesus' disciples didn't "get it," but I think coach Leach did. I hope we do! □
