Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." John 14:6

> ne of the most difficult truths of Christianity is that there's but one way to heaven: Jesus Christ. People would rather believe that all paths lead to God—and that no religion can exclude someone. But in John 14:6, Jesus claimed, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life," and explicitly said, "No one comes to the Father except through Me."

> That raises an important question: How can Jesus be the ONLY way to heaven? It's not by means of religious rituals, merit, or self-effort because even "our righteous deeds are like a filthy garment" before God, Isaiah 64:6. Scripture provides the answers to the challenges humankind faces because of sin and death.

> source of power to reach heaven or the method of attaining it must begin with its possessor, God who founded all things. "The heavens are yours; the earth also is yours; the world and all that is in it, you have founded them, Psalm 89:11. Jesus is hailed as the Creator of all, John 1:1-4. Whose word would carry more weight than the Creator-God, Jesus?

SAVIOR – Man's need for a savior goes back to the beginning Bible story of the garden of Eden. Fellowship with God and access to the tree that leads away from condemnation and into the of life was obstructed from the beginning because of the man's own sin, Genesis 3:23-24. Adam and said, "I am the only true and living way!" Why Eve needed a Savior to save them from death in

sin, cf. Genesis 2:17. Every sinner shares their need, and no sinner will enter God's home, Romans 3:23. God promised the "Seed of woman" as the Savior man desperately needs, Genesis 3:15. Jesus is the seed of woman, Galatians 4:4. Whose claim should be given place beyond that of the promised Savior, Jesus?

ATONEMENT – Justice demands a penalty for sin be exacted. The debt must be paid, Ezekiel 18:20. Humankind can make no claim on heaven apart from an atonement for his guilt before God; Jesus is the propitiate for the sins of the world, Romans 6:23; 1 John 2:2. Whose path back to God in heaven would be more trustworthy than that of the atoning sacrifice, Jesus?

RESURRECTION – The grave and eternal judgment loom in the future of every person, Hebrews 9:27. Long before man had seen or heard any promise of resurrection Job asked, "If a man dies, shall he live again" Job 14:14. Death is the great human dilemma. No man can ascend the grave into heaven apart from Jesus. Only Jesus **GOD** – Any person seeking to know either the conquered death and the grave never to die again, 1 Corinthians 15:1-3; cf. 15:20. Jesus conquered death and defeated every power that seeks to prevent humankind from being with God eternally, Colossians 2:8-15. Whose word will you accept above the resurrected Christ, Jesus?

> Salvation is narrow. Rare, valuable and precious things are only carefully attained. Why wouldn't the path to Heaven be the same? Salvation through Christ is restricted to those who have faith in and obey Jesus. He is the only path eternal glory of heaven. Heed His word when He wouldn't you give your allegiance fully to Him?

Selfless Determination Michael W. McLemore

During the Crimean War Florence Nightingale rose by 4:30 a.m. to leave for the battlefields, where inferior medical care caused British soldiers to die unnecessarily. After incredible exploits, saving lives with her contingent of trained nurses, Nightingale returned home to England. Restricted to her sick bed, she somehow managed to establish, at age forty, the Nightingale School and Home for Nurses in London. She created a medical revolution from her bed and continued to mastermind and direct those efforts until her death at age ninety.

Such unmitigated selfless determination is admired and applauded by all who observe it. But, Nightingale is not the first to exhibit great commitment in the face of cruel adversity. The first century physician and historian, Luke, recorded the apostle Paul's commitment to continue his mission despite the promise of arrest and the threat of death by both Jews and Romans — "What do you mean by weeping and breaking my heart? For I am ready not only to be bound, but to die at Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus," Acts 21:13.

The same Paul, later wrote to the church at Philippi this time from Rome, saying, "I want you to know, brethren, that the things which happened to me have actually turned out for the furtherance of the gospel," Philippians 1:12-14.

Nightingale and Paul each in turn changed the course of human history by their selfless determination. Such resolve begs for replication in modern local churches the world over!
