

eaching our potential as a Christian begins with a pure heart. The Bible book of God gives the blueprint for usefulness in the great house of the Master and calls upon us as vessels of honor to pursue holiness. Paul reminded the Thessalonians, "God has not called us for impurity, but holiness," 1 Thessalonians 4:7. This was not a one-shot message, but the pleading for purity of God's people was his constant appeal.

His young counterpart Timothy was given the same message. In context Paul just used the picture of God's building (the solid foundation of God stands). Now he thinks of that building as a great house that has a variety of vessels in it – bowls, plates, vases, and other such things, 2 Timothy 2:20-21. The metaphor firmly roots "usefulness in the great house of the Master" to purity.

For any vessel to be useful it must be

cleansed from what is dishonorable. Thorough cleansing is essential. Certain implements are "set apart" as holy. Their usefulness is critical, and preparation is required to address every good work.

Paul has Timothy in view as he went about the work appointed among God's people. His charges to "flee" the passions of immaturity in 2 Timothy 2:22-26 might be summarized this way:

Flee personal desire and pursue righteousness. Flee skepticism and pursue faith. Flee lust and pursue love. Flee debate and pursue peace.

God did his part in providing cleansing. As His children we must choose the sort of vessel we will be. This life of holiness is my responsibility, just as it is yours. Run away from sin, and toward God. We have work to prepare to do. Run from those impediments to service, and pursue holiness. God has called each of us to live as useful vessels.

Going Fishing

"And walking by the sea of Galilee, He saw two brothers, Simon who was called Peter, and Andrew his brother casting a net into the sea; for they were fishermen. And He said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fishers of men.' And they immediately left the nets, and followed Him. And going on from there He saw two other brothers, James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets; and He called them. And they immediately left the boat and their father, and followed Him," Matthew 4:18-22; cf. Mark 1:16-20. These first disciples were not forced to follow Jesus. They had a choice to continue to fish since they did not know this total stranger. But there must have been something they saw in Jesus, or what He said, that struck a chord in their hearts. There was a certain power in His statement that caused them to want to know more. We later learn the names of the other apostles in the book of Matthew. Jesus gave them strict instructions regarding their behavior when sending them out into the world to spread the message of the Gospel.

In Acts 2 we learn more about the disciples and their love for Jesus. How awesome it must have been for them to know Jesus personally and demonstrate their love for Him. Being able to spend time with Him and to know His purpose, especially after being filled with the Holy Spirit, had to be undeniably the greatest experience they would ever know. These fishermen would show their skills when delivering the message to those on the day of Pentecost. We are all well versed that on that day when about three thousand souls were saved after being baptized. What a big catch!

Today we learn from their example and follow it. We understand that we too must not be afraid to cast our net. It is very simple: we must take the story of Jesus, and the message He has given us, and speak it out into

the world around us. Romans 10:14 states, "And how shall they believe in Him whom they have not heard?" Our net is the gospel. You must cast it to catch the heart of lost souls. Don't expect to make a catch every time you cast your net, but keep trying.

THINGS TO REMEMBER:

- ► Be patient.
- Understand the risk and the rewards.
- Focus on the casting, not on how many fish (people) you catch.
- Understand our "nets" will require mending and repair at times. (Continue bible study and learn a growing knowledge of the best approach.)
- It's okay to take more time if you don't get the results

you want at first.

- Don't give up.
- ► Cast again and again.
- ► Keep sharing the gospel.
- You don't need to have any special talents to try.
- Remember to catch them before you try to clean them. (Start with preaching Jesus first, and allow other instruction to continue over time.)
- You need to have a love for the Word and a desire to help save the lost.
- You can't catch anything if you don't cast your net.

It's ironic, when you fish, you take your catch out of the water. When you convert, you take your catch (people) into the water (the water of baptism). Continue the legacy of the original disciples to be fishers of men. Remember the great commission, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I commanded you," *Matthew* 28:19. So, yes, the gospel is for all. Now go, cast your net!

The Hands of Jesus Adapted

During World War II, a church building in Strasbourg was destroyed.

I wonder do you see something around you that Christ needs to take care of today? He has no hands. but OUR hands! □
