A LACK OF COMMUNICATION

woman visited a local lawyer and in distress implored, "My husband wants to divorce me. I need help." The lawyer questioned, "Does he have grounds?" She answered, "About twenty acres." With a bit of a smile, he again inquired, "No. Does he have a grudge?" Unwittingly, the lady answered, "No. I think it's carport." Now flustered, the lawyer asked even more frankly, "Does he beat you up?" Without a blink, the clueless wife answered, "No. I usually get up before him." The lawyer sat back confident that he now understood the problem and said, "I think what we have here is a lack of communication."

The woman in this amusing anecdote illustrates well the generation of whom Jesus said, "You will indeed hear but never understand, and you will indeed see but never perceive," *Matthew* 13:14. Like the lawyer and his clueless client, Jesus recognized the problem with His contemporaries.

"Hearing but not understanding" can have several root causes. Basic ignorance of the subject matter can present a challenge with communication. Preconception can impede one from entertaining the truth though honestly presented. Prejudice can close one's mind to any need for change. The problem in Jesus' generation was not ignorance of, preconception with or prejudice toward God. It was tradition – "This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines the commandments of men," *Matthew 15:9*. Jesus was not speaking to a people ignorant of God or His ways. Their minds were closed to any teacher or doctrine that did not comport with Jewish tradition.

Modern believers, be forewarned. Something as basic as completing communication became a mighty challenge even for Jesus. Long believed and practiced human tradition made teaching them virtually impossible because the people had closed their minds to the possibility of being in error. Would we not prefer to be among those disciples whom Jesus commended, "blessed are your eyes, for they see, and your ears, for they hear," and not people incapable of hearing then understanding? Take heed lest you fall.

Fundamentals of Following

"THEN JESUS SAID UNTO HIS DISCIPLES, 'If any man would come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me," Matthew 16:24

hat a profound statement! In one short sentence Jesus sums up the essence of discipleship. Here is the heart of the matter: the decision, the duty, the denial and the direction — all of which are fundamental in following Christ. To begin with, note the conditional aspects of this following. "If" one follows Christ it is necessary that he do certain things (the doing of which in no way implies any merited or earned favor). "If" also imolies the necessity of making a choice. One may or may not decide to follow Christ, but decide he must. The term "would" (Grk. thelo) indicates volition, an exercise of the will. Many would-be disciples have simply not made up their minds to be wholehearted followers of the Lord. Not that they have not changed a few externals; not that they have not decided to be religious or to "join the church" — they have just not settled the matter as to whether Christ will be Lord of their lives. That is the real decision and making that one also settles hundreds of little "side" issues so bothersome to so many. No man can be a faithful follower until this first "if" is decided, and even then, it is just the beginning.

Accordingly, deciding "yes" about following Christ means deciding "no" about serving self — "let him deny himself' Jesus says. This includes, but is not limited to, putting away things. It means developing proper attitudes toward self; learning that ...ye are not your own; for ye were bought with a price," 1 Corinthians 6:19,20. Here is the real bat-

tleground of the soul; self must be conquered and controlled if Christ is to be followed, *Romans* 7:22,23; 1 Corinthians 9:25-27.

Then every follower must "take up his cross" — this involves every duty and responsibility in connection with serving the Lord. As the term "cross of Christ" is sometimes used in a genera way to show all that Christ has done for sinful man, 1 Corinthians 1:18; Galatians 6:12, taking up our cross includes all that we do for the Lord. And, as indicated in Luke 14:27, each must bear his "own cross." There can be no representative involvement. As Christ's cross was peculiarly His and none other could have done what He did, so it is with ours. You must bear your cross, you must do the will of the Father as Jesus did, John 17:4. (It is neither legalistic nor anti-grace to teach that men MUST do something to please God — in fact it is unscriptural and anti-scriptural to teach otherwise!) Without this personal cross-bearing Jesus says, you "cannot be my disciple," Luke 14:26.

Finally, following Christ involves the matter of direction, as is clearly suggested in "come after me" and "follow me." Remember, the initial decision was WHETHER to follow Christ, not HOW. To do as "self" pleases and call it "following the Lord" violates every fundamental that Jesus addresses in this proclamation. To follow is to live by His word, *Matthew 4:4*; to do ALL in His name, *Colossians 3:17*; to abide in His doctrine, *2 John 9*. "Where He leads me... I will follow." Will you?
