# FIND REFUGE IN THE LORD

he Psalmist wondered, "Why do the nations L conspire and the peoples plot in vain?" Psalm 2:1. It is a foolish king and reckless subjects who plot rebellion against God. Rulers and leaders of the earth have set themselves against the Lord and His Anointed. They think that they can cast off God's rule and establish their own kingdoms, but this writer warns them that their efforts are futile — "He who sits in the heavens laughs; the Lord holds them in derision," 4.

Psalm 2 is a powerful declaration of God's sovereignty over all nations and peoples. It speaks of the rebellion of the nations against God and His Anointed — the coming Christ and His response to their defiance. While it's fulfillment is in Jesus, its sentiment is relevant today.

The Son is set down as the singular authority over heaven and earth. The nations are His heritage, the ends of the earth are His possession, Matthew 28:18. The kingdoms of the earth are broken and consumed by His kingdom, 7-9; cf. Daniel 2:44. Nations plot in vain against His

authority. Submitting to God's rule and to serving the Lord with fear and trembling is their only salvation — "Blessed are all who take refuge in Him," 12.

Three things come to mind. First, God is in control of all nations and peoples, and no one can resist His will. Wisdom says, "Stand with God! Serve the Lord!" Second, rebellion against God is foolish. Its ultimate end is ruin. Last, Jesus Christ is the King of kings and Lord of lords, and His kingdom will endure forever. Embrace Him. Only in Him is salvation, blessing and divine protection found.

The message of Psalm 2 is timeless. Its message forms the foundation of the Christian's appeal to a people who are searching for direction in a nation who has forgotten God. Let us as His people first model submission to God's rule and then serve Him with fear and trembling. Take refuge in Jesus Christ [the Anointed], our King and Savior, and trust in Him to guide us and protect us. May we be among the blessed who find refuge in the Lord.

of New Testament Christianity. Think now what it would mean if she apostatized. Think of the millions of souls yet unborn that might never hear a gospel sermon. Yet today we're playing with the fire that could consume the church in apostasy. We hear on every hand, "If you can't get men who meet all the qualifications of the elder get the best you have." I have observed that in almost every small congregation for which I have preached that at least one or more socalled elders do not meet the qualifications. This trend has been created by a lack of men qualified for the eldership and ultimately a failure of Christians to be living sacrifices. It is because we do not have enough mothers and fathers who impress upon their young sons the nobility and importance of the work of an elder and consequently cause them to aspire to it. Until this situation be changed the doctrinal soundness of the church rests on very shaky ground (pp. 280-281).
