

# "IT'S WHAT GOD KNOWS"

esus reassured His disciples whom He sent out under His limited commission, "And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell," Matthew 10:28. Other men will not approve of God's appointments but what power do they have in God's ultimate scheme or in His final analysis? I don't care if others don't approve of me. They're not my ultimate judge. I will stand before God, not them. It's what God knows that matters.

Paul later asked a rhetorical question of his Galatian critics, "For am I now seeking the approval of man, or of God? Or am I trying to please man? If I were still trying to please man, I would not be a servant of Christ," Galatians 1:10. His point? He formerly sought approval of those who stood in the path of his career as a Jewish prosecutor. No more. All of that changed once confronted with the truth of Jesus' resurrection, Acts 9: 1-20. Note Paul's interesting choice of the word "servant" from the Greek "doulos," that culture's word for slave. What slave is concerned with what someone who is not their master thinks? Would a slave focus more on what other people think about them or what their Master knows about them? It's what God knows that matters.

The more a child of God matures the less concerned he becomes with what unbelieving or even weak-minded Christians think of him. The faithful "servant" wants only to please God. Many didn't put their faith in Christ for fear of the Pharisees, John 12:42-43. It is a sad state of affairs that what others think could become the determining factor over what one should or should not believe about Jesus. The fear or concern of what others think must never be allowed to become a stumbling block to faith, Proverbs 29:25. Who cares what men think. It's what God knows that matters.

# Living in the Far Country

uke chapter fifteen has long been a favorite of many Bible students. This wonderful chapter serves as God's 'lost and found' of the Bible. In it we read of a lost sheep, a lost coin, and two lost boys, Luke 15:11-32. In this piece, we want to focus our attention on the more famous of the two lost boys – the prodigal son.

Most know the story well. The prodigal son requests his inheritance, which certainly was an insult to his living father, 11f. The text then set forth the following: "And not many days after, the younger son gathered all together, journeyed to a far country, and there wasted his possessions with prodigal (wasteful) living," 13. In the far country,

Sin had taken him farther than he had ever wanted to go. When we choose to live in the far country of sin, we cut ourselves off from the innumerable blessings found only in Christ,

the son who had been sick of home suddenly became homesick when he realized the mistake he made. Therefore, having come to himself, he determined to return to the father he had forsaken. The homecoming of the son to his father has a way of bringing tears to the eyes; through it we see the sheer joy of reconciliation. The happiness of the occasion is evident in the father's response. He calls for his servants and gave a great feast in honor of his son that was dead but was alive again; who

was lost but was found, 20-24.

Why do so many chose to leave the confines of their spiritual home, the church to live in the far country? Living in the far country is never without its cost. We forfeit a great deal by choosing to live in the far locale of sinful living. Consider that living in the far country means that we have chose to live:

#### FAR FROM THE FATHER

When the prodigal left the father the relation-

ship they had was severed, cf. 24. Leaving the light of God's way for the darkness of the world relinquishes fellowship with God and His Son Jesus, *John 1:5-7*. Why do we make such decisions? Thanks be to God that we have a Father who continues to wait for you and me to come to ourselves that the relationship between us might again be made whole through Christ, cf. 1 John 1:9; Acts

#### **FAR FROM PRODUCTIVE LIVING**

Jesus described the prodigal's life in the far country as "wasteful," 13. Any life that is devoid of glorifying God becomes a useless life, Isaiah 43:7; 1 Corinthians 10:31. Let us make sure that we never waste one hour in the pursuit of sinful liv-

#### FAR FROM BLESSING

In the far country the prodigal son was "in want," 14. Sin had taken him farther than he had ever wanted to go. When we choose to live in the far country of sin, we cut ourselves off from the innumerable blessings found only in Christ, Ephesians 1:3.

#### FAR FROM HAPPINESS

The happiness experienced by the prodigal was short lived at best, 13; cf. Hebrews 11:24, 25. The Prodigal would never know real, genuine happiness until he was at home again with his father. The same holds true for those who would stray from their heavenly Father. Sin offers some pleasure, but its end result is death, James 1:12-16; Romans 6:23. If you've wandered away, won't you return to the place where real rejoicing is found Philippians 4:4.

Are you living in the far country of sinful living? God is still calling the prodigal today. Come home while you still can. □
