For the Christian, wishful hoping about the future is a thing of the past. It is replaced by the joyous expectation of being with and like the Lord Jesus Christ when He comes again. Our hope truly "springs eternal" We have a better hope in Christ.  $\square$

# IT MIGHT SURPRISE YOU

ne of the serious problems confronting the churches today is the instability of the marriages among many of their constituents. A generation ago divorce was common among people of the world, but more or less uncommon among professed New Testament Christians. Today, the churches have caught up with the world in this respect.

One of the chief excuses offered by many who choose to sever the marriage bond is: "Our marriage has become so dull and boring: I just don't love him or her anymore." There are several valid, Scriptural replies that one can make to such a plea, but I should like to focus on just one: namely. If couples would "nourish" their spouses as Paul teaches, *Ephesians 5:29*, they might not find their spouses so dull and their marriages so boring.

Almost twenty years ago (1970's), I read and preserved in my files an anecdote that appeared in Parade Magazine which Illustrates my point. It follows:

The jealous husband was sure his wife had a boyfriend, so he hired a detective to shadow her and take movies of what he saw. A few weeks later the detective reported with the film. "Well, here it is," he said, "all of the evidence – and with your best friend too!"

He ran the film, and the husband saw pictures of his wife and his best friend as they ate lunch, took a swim, bowled and danced. After a while the husband shook his head and said, "I can't believe it, I just can't believe it!" "But the evidence is all here," said the detective. "That' not what I mean," answered the husband, "I just can't believe my wife is that much fun!"

There is no telling how surprised many husbands and wives might be, who think their spouses are dull and boring, if they tried "nourishing" them instead of taking them for granted. Our Lord saw limitless possibilities in sinners and "gave himself up for them" that he might create of them his holy, spiritual spouse, the church. He then "nourished and cherished" his spouse thus created in order to make his vision reality and present her "to himself a glorious church without spot or wrinkle, holy and without blemish" *Ephesians 5:22-27*.

When two people meet, "fall in love" and marry, they are motivated by a splendid vision of unending bliss. However, too many assume such to be inevitable, that it will just happen. In the words of Paul, "they see in a glass darkly." It doesn't "just happen."

Jesus knew that the salvation of sinners from past sins, thus constituting them his spiritual bride, was not by itself enough [He did not believe in "once saved, always saved!"]. He knew that the relationship had to be "nourished and cherished." Consequently, He provided for the edification and perfection of those thus saved that they might "abide in Him," 1 John 2;1-6, hence as His holy bride be preserved spiritually from "spot and wrinkle" and "holy and without blemish" be united with him gloriously both in time and eternity!

Since the union of Christ and His church set forth by the Holy Spirit a model for the married, we who are married should recognize the absolute necessity of "nourishing and cherishing" the relationship with the same sacrificial love for our spouses that Christ manifested toward us in the spiritual realm. Let us "give ourselves" for one another, nourish and cherish each other, in every aspect of the relationship in the fear of God. No marriage thus established and maintained will ever become "dull and boring." It is worthy of repetition: It might surprise you "how much fun your husband or wife can be!"
