he world constantly pressures us to adopt a way of thinking that is contrary to God's Word. Christian faith is incessantly attacked in our generation in virtually every public forum. Unless one makes some effort to combat this onslaught of propaganda, he will fall victim to its debilitating poison. Satan wants Christians to accept his lies and, as a result, leave them vulnerable to temptation.

I'm sure a case could be made for many ways to address this onslaught of viciousness. Wouldn't you agree that one of the best ways to counter the Devil's attack is to fill the mind with Scripture? Memorizing scripture has become a lost art. Scripture needs to be fresh in our thinking, and flowing from the core of who we are. What better way than memorizing it? But, where do we start? Let me suggest a few things.

First, learn to exchange Satan's lies for God's truth. Focus on the areas in which you are most tempted. Second, set small goals. Remember, the ultimate goal is not to memorize Scripture, but to live a godly life because you have God's Word "hidden in your heart."

Third, "if you don't use it, you lose it." Review your previously internalized passages on a regular basis. Implement a review system.

Fourth, personalize scripture. David did this in his psalms. "Lord, I choose to set my mind on things above and not on things on earth, for I have died and my life is hidden with Christ in God."

Finally, audibly recite God's word. Jesus did!

Christians get bombarded by daily pressures to adopt the standards of this world. Memorizing God's Word realigns our thoughts with the Lord's values and standards. Refreshing your mind with the His eternal perspective will help you resist the temptation to conform to the world, *Romans12:2*. Then you won't be prey to Satan's lies.

The Kingdom of God SWITHIN YOU!

hrist, in replying to the Pharisees' misunderstanding of the nature of the kingdom, said, "The kingdom of God cometh not with observation: neither shall they say, lo, here! or, there! for lo, the kingdom of God is within you," Luke 17:21.

It is obvious that the nature of the kingdom is misunderstood by the religious world today. It is likewise abundantly obvious that many within the kingdom have no clear conception as to what it is all about – verily, some think it is "eating and drinking", unsuitably called fellowship. We can further narrow the view and find "faithful" members of "faithful" churches who do not seem to have the foggiest notion of what it means to "let the word of Christ dwell in you richly," and who seem totally unaware of the importance of Hebrews 8:10: "For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, saith the Lord; I will put my laws into their mind, and on their heart also will I write them: and I will be to them a God, and they shall be to me a people." I was asked some time ago about the meaning of this passage, thus this piece arose from my deeper consideration of it.

The Savior expressed it in these words to the woman at the well: "...whosoever drinketh of the water that, I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall become in him a well of water springing up unto eternal life," *John 4:14*. Paul's words in Ephesians 6:6 also have a bearing upon the subject as he urged Christians to serve their employers "not...as men-pleasers; but as servants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart...."

It is admitted that not all of these passages are dealing with the same subject in their context. But, I want us to notice that whatever subject is discussed, the in-

nermost feelings and motives of man are considered. "As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he." How sorely needed is the disposition of members of the church to have the kingdom of God within them, and to have God's commandments in their hearts. How superficial and shallow is the kingdom in the lives of so many. We must understand, the kingdom of Christ is a "kingdom of souls."

Consider the person who absents himself from the assembling together of the saints to go fishing, to entertain company, or to voluntarily work for a little more money. Is the kingdom of God really within that person? Does the word of Christ dwell so richly within him that his every thought and deed is regulated by the will of the one who gave His own life for us? Is this the joyful expression of that well of water springing up within him unto eternal life? Is this the result of the fervent desire within that person to do the will of God from the heart? We know that it is not!

It is hard to express the thought that came to me that very day as I contemplated what it would be like if all the members of the kingdom really and truly had the kingdom of God within them. Think of the tremendous saving of time, energy, and effort that could then be put to use toward those who have not the gospel, and who have absolutely no hope of everlasting life!

Consider it seriously. Does the word of Christ dwell richly in your heart? Is the kingdom of God really with you? Do you love the Lord, or are you creating more work for others to do? Are you helping to solve problems, or are you a part of the problem? Are you working to save others, or are you helping them to be lost because time has to be taken from teaching them in order to keep you on the track? Consider it well, for eternity depends upon it.
