

Authority & Jesus

uthority is a word that makes some people cringe. Undoubtedly we live in an age when it is popular to rebel against authority. The fads of the sixties are back with a vengeance and with them are rebellion against convention. We find ourselves longing for the days when children only mutilated their bodies with piercings and tattoos. Appearance is symbolic of their rebellion. Decorum, simple propriety, and conventional thinking are out the window. Authority is taboo! It's everywhere. It's even invading the Lord's church, and that's frightening!

Jeremiah wrote of the unrestrained life in Jeremiah 2:24. He lamented the lack of respect for authority: "Who can turn them away from their pleasure?" Christians must "awaken out of their sleep." God's people are not immune from the influence of a culture turning away from God's authority.

The Christian is a person under "Authority"!

He doesn't direct his own footsteps for this is the apex of foolishness. He is bound to respect and to adhere to it. The child of God places himself under authority of Jesus' own example. Jesus did not rebel against authority, but neither did He foolishly exploit his position as the Son of the Creator. Consider Jesus's example.

Jesus' life demonstrated the humility of submitting to the Father's authority to direct our lives. Jesus respected the authority of his parents. He taught his disciples to respect the authority of civil government. Above all, Jesus recognized the authority of the scriptures, and dealt with his own authority in an uncompromising and humble way. In everything he did, Jesus appreciated the power and authority of God. If Jesus is going to be our example, we cannot help but notice how He dealt with authority, how he respected it himself, taught others to respect it, and lived a life of evident adherence to God's authority.

Back to the Beginning

bout A.D. 60, Paul wrote to the Colossians: "Beware lest anyone cheat you through philosophy and vain deceit, according to the tradition of men, according to the basic principles of the world, and not according to Christ, *Colossians 2:8*.

Ungodly philosophy has long been the enemy of true faith. Unlike faith, it ministers to pride, it encourages the notion that the way of man is in himself and that he can discover spiritual truth for himself without divine revelation; it even rejects divine revelation with which it disagrees. It places a premium on human intellect and elevates philosophers above ordinary men. By providing rationalization for sin, it removes the shame that should humble the sinner.

The need for Paul's warning is evident from the Lord's letters to the churches of Asia (the province where Colossae was located) and from John's epistles written from Asia. By the time these where written (possibly 30 years later), human philosophies had infiltrated many of the churches. They had done their pernicious work: questioning the inspired revelation of the nature of Christ, puffing up with pride, disdaining love for the brethren, and justifying immorality and ungodliness of every kind.

Much is to be learned from John's inspired challenge to such philosophies in his epistles.

John did not attempt to meet the philosophers on their own turf. The very nature of human philosophy makes absolute conclusions impossible. Any effort to oppose philosophy with philosophy will result in the kind of "useless wrangling" and "foolish disputes" against which Paul warned both Timothy and Titus. Neither did John speak the truth in technical and academic language which would appeal to pride.

Rather, John, guided by the Holy Spirit, spoke with all of the authority of an apostle concerning the basic tenets of the faith: the character of God, the principles involved in sin, the human and divine nature of Jesus Christ, His great work on our behalf, the absolute necessity of fellowship with God and Christ, and the love, the purity, the attitudes toward truth and error which such fellowship requires. And he stated these in the simplest, most direct language possible. In glaring light of such basic truth, the reasoning of ungodly men appeared in its true colors.

Today, Christians are again threatened by ungodly philosophies: Humanism, New Age, and a host of others. Taught in schools and colleges, the enjoy dignity and influence which they do not deserve. They invade our minds through books, TV, paid counselors, and through conversations with our associates. All too often, elements of these philosophies are surfacing in Bible classes and some preaching is more pop-psychology and modernistic theology than Bible. Human philosophy is bearing the same fruit it bore in the first century: pride, questions regarding the nature of Jesus, and rationalization to justify every form of immorality.

"There is only one answer for the religious division and corrupting doctrines of our day, and that answer is the same as it was in John's day: back to the beginning—back to the source of truth—back to the apostles."
