What has the Lord instructed you to do? Have you only partially complied, or have you relinquished your need for complete understanding and followed His guidance wholeheartedly? What the Lord calls you to give on His altar of sacrifice, rest assured that you can place your trust in Him to provide.

In Memory of a Stalwart Servant

vershadowing the gentle green slopes outside the city of ancient Bethel stood for unknown centuries a Terebinth (oak) tree. Beneath that notable oak lay the mortal remains of a stalwart servant named Deborah. The shade of the lonely oak is not the resting place of the great judge and deliverer of Israel. Instead, in that isolated parcel was the prostrate body of "first Deborah," nurse of Jacob's beloved Rebekah, interred. Moses said, "And Deborah, Rebekah's nurse, died, and she was buried under an oak below Bethel. So he called its name Allon-bacuth," *Genesis 35:8.* Jacob called the tree *Allon-bacuth*, "mourning oak," and forever was the name of that great tree.

Few are aware of this Deborah in the Genesis "book of beginnings." Still the Holy Spirit of God held space for her. One may ask, as have many scholars, why include this perplexing credit to an "ordinary nurse" among the great records of the creation, global deluge or of the deaths of the nobles? One's assumption is that she was "ordinary." She was far from it. At her death the whole household of Israel stood still and mourned her passing. So great was the mourning and the weeping at Deborah's funeral that the oak under which she was buried forevermore bore the name that immortalized the sadness that overtook God's family.

So it is as the family of God mourns the death of another of God's stalwart servants, our beloved Becky Shaw. Were she to be laid beneath a mighty oak those who loved her in life could fittingly memorialize the loss we feel today by naming it with the Hebrew name, *Allon-bacuth*.

The range of adjectives that might be ascribed

to Becky Shaw would surely be long — Brilliant, empathetic, selfless, ingenious, altruistic, devoted, inspirational, wise, and visionary. Those who knew and loved Miss Becky have witnessed greatness and are enriched for the observation. Her service was never for notoriety or for credit. She lent her hand to countless projects, classes, studies and other services over her more than 27 year association with the Weatherly Heights church of Christ. Long hours and toil from day into night was certainly required to meet a myriad of needs of which she became aware. Like a nursing mother, she has served and nourished us for no other reason than her abiding love and devotion both to God and to His people.

Becky Shaw was part of our family and we were part of hers. The brilliance with which she approached life and even the most casual of conversations left us amazed. We loved being in her presence. In each setting she was like a master of ceremony, and never was there a dull moment. Miss Becky was loved in life and is mourned in death. Her memory will live on for us and her empty seat among our ranks can never be adequately filled. Still, though we sorrow, we sorrow not as others who have no hope. We long to see her face again in the morning of joy.

"The Oak of Weeping" that once graced the slopes outside Bethel has ago long passed and gone the way of all the earth, but the living Bible book of God reminds its readers of the legacy of one of His stalwart servants in the family of God's people. A woman that an unknowing world might describe as an "ordinary servant" is ascribed greatness and regarded as stalwart by those who knew her best.
