Fellowship with God begins with a clean heart. Those who love the Lord desire to obey Him. Still, we fall short. We tend to self gratification. Jeremiah warned, "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately sick; who can understand it?" Jeremiah 17:9 Every child of God wrestles with this.

David pled, "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me," Psalm 51:10. In His pleading he expressed the need of all human kind after succumbing to sin. "Heart cleansing" is divine work. The Holy Spirit of God caused David to use the "creation word" first employed as the descriptor of God's work — "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth." God is willing to do for man what man cannot do for himself "if" man will repent and in faith submit himself to God. Becoming the person God planned for each of us to be requires an intimate relationship with Him and a desire to obey His Word. Wilderness Moments Michael W. McLemore

By definition a wilderness is a lonely place. The vast deserts of the earth are trackless expanses that seem to go on forever. Walk for a mile in any direction and the terrain looks the same. Climb over a hill and all you see is more of the same. Even though you may actually be surrounded by people, in the wilderness you feel all alone.

Many are living in what they perceive as a wilderness — Abandoned, forgotten, discarded. We have all been there — Waiting for a call back after a long anticipated interview. Needing good news from medical tests. Watching as the savings is depleted. Worrying over children. Wondering if I can even make it through another month. These are common wilderness experiences.

It's easy during tense, taut, fearful moments to think, "God has forgotten me." But, in reality it's the other way around. During those times I'm the one who has forgotten God.

The apostle Paul found himself living the wilderness experience in 2 Timothy 4:16, "At my first defense no one came to stand by me, but all deserted me." He was literally suffering alone at the hands of his Roman captors. It was in that experience that Paul showed us the secret. Listen to his hopefulness, "But the Lord stood by me and strengthened me..." 17. He was not alone in his desert, and neither are we! \Box
