"Officious Reverence"

When a friend does something that we deem harmful to us, we often say, "With friends like that, we don't need enemies." The Holy Spirit moved Paul to write concerning certain professed disciples (friends) of Christ, "Many walk, of whom I have told you often, and not tell you even weeping, they are the enemies of the cross of Christ," *Philippians 3:18*. F.W. Farrar, in his *History of Interpretation*, says "Even when the Ark seems to totter, it is more really profaned by the Uzzah-hands of officious reverence than by the rudeness of the Philistines," 6.

Under the fair name of "piety," zealots have done as much to besmirch the reputation of the gospel and the Lord's church as the avowed enemies among believers. This falls with equal force upon the

visionary liberal of the far left and the anathematizing conservative of the far right. The "Uzzah-hands of officious reverence" that hesitate not to take hold of consecrated things to alter them are to be found active among both. They may function to liberalize or to obstruct.

Righteous concern and enlightened "exhortation to love and good works" on a personal level are never to be discouraged among the saints, but let us be very sure that we understand the difference between healthy concern and constructive admonition and officious meddling and destructive condemnation. When a situation transcends personal and individual relationships and involves group fellowship in worship and service, true piety always defers to the duly constituted overseers of the congregation, and in the absence of compelling evidence of their failure to dispose of the matter scripturally and ethically, to acquiesce in their action. To agitate such matters under the guise of reverence for truth is, in every sense of the expression, "Uzzah-hands of officious reverence." it breathes the "party spirit" and promotes strife and division. However, what party-minded, extremist ever believed he merited the designation? □

When the word of God is preached and your life is not in harmony with what is taught, will you take offence? Or, will you even notice? The Lord is pleading through His word for you to repent. Why not believe and obey?

It is easy to so crowd the mind with worldly affairs that no room is left for serious thought about eternity. Rest assured, we will either consider it now, or we will face the point of God's finger of judgement later. ☐
