I often hear when encouraging participation in some Christian duty, "that it is optional." This gets me to thinking. Is anything optional with God? It strikes me as dangerous to think "we don't have to do this good work...it is not required." I think I know what is meant, that certain things are not commanded of us, but permitted of God, but the attitude is dangerous and here is why.

The Bible says things like "Be ready unto every good work," or "If you know to do good and do not do so, it is sinful," or "Be zealous for good works," or "Maintain good works."

I am concerned that some are seeking to dumb down their salvation to the least bit required. How slow can a person go, and still cross the finish line? Missing: is the "Extra Mile" mentality.

And how do we determine which good

works the Lord has both instructed us to do and through His providence given opportunity to do, are optional? Is that not judging God's word?

Deciding which is required and which is optional? James 2 says we are not to judge God's word. We are to be doers of the work. \Box

(I appreciate Whit Sasser's challenge to rethink the standard by which many have come to judge what faithful service looks like. The modern notion of "tell me what is required and what is optional" is not only unfortunate, it's dangerous. From the very start of His earthly ministry Jesus said, "It's not about being compelled to serve, it's about going far beyond expectation," paraphrase Matthew 5:41. Becoming an "extra mile servant" is not easy, but when we begin to serve the Lord that way, it becomes a powerful motivator to all who see and experience it! MWM)

Strong marriages

are not accidental nor are they the result of following after human wisdom. Entering into marriage ought not to be an uncharted course into the fog. Faith requires dependency on God, 2 Corinthians 5:7. Therefore, an excellent starting point for all who enter into marriage is to realize that "Unless the Lord builds the house, they labor in vain who build it..." Psalm 127:1.

Young people can and must enter into marriage with a firm grasp of what makes it successful. Every marriage requires adjustments. But, there are three fundamental principles which must be accepted by those seeking to prepare themselves for the lifelong work of building a Christian home.

Make God the primary partner in your marriage relationship. A Christian marriage is not about "the two of us." Solomon tells us that "a man might prevail against one who is alone, two will withstand him-a threefold cord is not quickly broken," Ecclesiastes 4:12. Make your marriage a three-strand relationship, centered around God as the primary focus of your lives.

Make your spouse first in all earthly relationships. To him or her there is no rival. In the beginning, God said that "a man shall leave his father and his mother and

hold fast to his wife, and they shall become one flesh," Genesis 2:24. Your relationship with your mate has a higher priority than your relationship to your parents, your children, or your friends. It has a higher priority than your job, your recreational pursuits, or any civic cause in which you might engage. Therefore, steadfast loyalty is required in a Christian marriage.

Make the unselfish attitude of Christ your constant pursuit as you seek to meet the needs of your spouse. Paul says: "Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others," Philippians 2:3-4.

Instead of merely asking if your prospective mate has obeyed the Gospel and is a member of the Lord's church, perhaps, you should be asking if he or she puts God first in their life, if he or she is willing to make you their number one priority among all earthly relationships, and if he or she is the kind of person who is genuinely unselfish and humble in the way they treat you.

Above all, be the kind of person you want to marry. You cannot change others, you can only change yourself. Know that your church family wants you to succeed in this most precious of earthly relationships. \Box

well known disciple of Jesus. But, he epitomized genuine servanthood. Again and again he demonstrated the mark of the true steward. He was faithful, 1 Corinthians trustworthiness — is a characteristic enjoined upon every child of God. Observe it in Epaphroditus from Paul's Philippians letter.

PAUL COUNTED ON HIM, 2:25

— Paul relied on Epaphroditus. In one verse the apostle identified five characteristics of dependability: "my brother... fellow worker... soldier... your messenger," and "minister to my needs."

PAUL KNEW OF HIS COMPAS-

SION, 2:26 — Epaphroditus longed for the Philippians believers. He was distressed because of their concern for him. His love and concern for the help he could be endeared him to others.

PAUL BOASTED OF HIS COM-MITMENT, 2:29-30 — This trusted messenger and servant completed his self-imposed duty without regard for himself. Epaphroditus was so committed that he almost died for the work.

The Lord needs faithful stewards today. Can He count on you? "It is required of stewards that they be found faithful."
