On one occasion Jesus heard the response, "I will follow thee, but let me first go bid them farewell, which are at home at my house," Luke 9:61. Such a replay was not relegated to that age. The same excuses are often employed by respondents today. Some say, when confronted with the passionate pleas of the Gospel, "Let me first get my education, a better job, a home, a new automobile, and the other necessary things of life."

We are not immune to these selfsame pretexts. Some have a place for Christ in their lives - second place! We tend to convince ourselves that material security will somehow prepare use to more ably follow Christ. This perception fails to grasp the meaning of Christ's words: "A man's life consists not in the abundance of the hings which he possesses," Luke 12:15. "Seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you," Matthew 6:33. Many have actually reversed the saying of Christ and are seeking first the wealth of the world thinking the kingdom of God will be added unto them.

The Lord assured that to gain the whole world is no bargain; but a single soul is worth more than all this world offers, Mark 8:36,37. None of us are apt to gain "the whole world." Why would we trade our most valuable eternal possession for a mere spec of this world's goods?

It's not wrong to work for a good education, a better job, a home or even a better car. The harm is in allowing these things to take precedence over the things of God's kingdom. What is first in your life? Is it Christ Jesus?

Many individuals professing to be New Testament Christians who would consider it quite heathen to bow down to a graven image (to) worship a God of their own creation. The Psalmist warned against this tendency when he quoted God as saying to the wicked: "These things hast that I was altogether such a one as thyself. ." (Ps. 50:21) Do we worship and serve God as He is revealed to us in His word? Or, do we worship and serve Him is we desire Him to be?

Frances Bacon wrote: "What a man had rather were true he more readily believes. Therefore he rejects difficult things from impatience of research; sober things, because they narrow hope; the deeper things of nature, from superstition; the light of experience, from arrogance and pride, lest his mind should seem to be occupied with things mean and transitory: things not commonly believed, out of deference to the opinion of the vulgar. Numberless in short are the wars, and sometimes imperceptible, in which affections color and infect the understanding." (Novum Organum via Logic and Language.)

Jesus impressively taught in the "Parable of the Sower" that the "good seed" — "the word of God" — takes root and grows to fruition only in the "good and honest heart," Luke 8:11-15. The more strongly therefore we desire to believe a thing, the more carefully we should guard against being deceived by our own predisposition!
