

the Lord which he purchased with his own blood," Acts 20:28, ASV. The church (souls of men and women, called out of the world of darkness) is the saved relationship or the redeemed body. Sinners are saved from their sins, liberated from their bondage, redeemed by the blood of Jesus. Jesus says, "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins," Matthew 26:28. Peter says, "Knowing that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot," 1 Peter 1:18-19. This body of people thus redeemed constitutes the church, the "called out."

Some people today imagine that they can be saved before and without becoming members of the church. In the light of the facts just noted, such an idea is utterly absurd, and scripturally unfounded. One can no more be saved without being a member of the Lord's church than he can be saved without being redeemed from his sins with the blood of Christ. So it was that in Jerusalem "the Lord added to them day by day those that were saved," Acts 2:47, ASV.

Being built by Christ and purchased with His blood, the church belongs to Him; it is purchased by Him. He said, "On this rock I will build my church." Congregations were known in New Testament times, therefore, as "churches of Christ," Romans 16:16. The church is the bride of Christ, Ephesians 5:23-33. It is the body of Christ, Colossians 1:18. It is the temple of the Lord, Ephesians 2:19 -23. It is God's husbandry and building, 1 Corinthians 3:9. This being true, not only is any human change in the church a reflection on divine wisdom, but also is a criminal trespass upon divine property. It's Christ's house, He built it!

The Cost of Joy

Paul wrote to invite his brethren to know what he knew about rejoicing. He said, "Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own..." Phil 3:12.

He knew that Joy in Christ comes with a price. Fellowship in the resurrection requires counting everything the world esteems as valuable as garbage to gain this greatest of all treasures. Paul emphasizes his personal commitment to make obtaining fellowship with Christ in both His suffering and ultimately in His resurrection only after first confessing that for him it is an ongoing pursuit — "Not that I have already obtained this, or am already perfect, 12. Constancy in both service and sacrifice is a daily affair, and the work is not complete while breath remains in the body.

The Greek word teleioō, translated "perfect," is "to bring to an end, or conclusion." Paul tells the Philippians, by way of example, "I have not already reached the goal, but I am stretching toward it to make it mine!" Paul's pursuit of Christ rises out of a profound dissatisfaction with the way he is. Contentment with one's present standing bespeaks Paul's own life lesson to the Philippians. "Christ made me His own possession," Paul said, "and, I am indebted to keep pressing forward to make Him my own possession." Rejoice!
