

onviction for the Christian is like an anchor fastened solidly in the word of God holding the child of God steady on the tempestuous seas of human opinion and the temptations of life. We must also reflect upon how powerfully that stability influences our peers, especially fellow Christians, during life's seminal moments. When I think of Biblical conviction Daniel always comes to mind.

Daniel impacted everyone with whom he came in contact. His critics despised him, but from fellow companions in captivity to the most powerful rulers of world empires, he was admired for his conviction. He knew who he was and what Jehovah wanted him to be. Daniel's purpose was not to impress others, but his convictions had an effect on everyone who came in contact with him. The word of God was his benchmark, *cf. Daniel 1:8; 6:5*.

It was Daniel's convictions, not his environment

or his peer group, that determined his behavior. Compromise is easy; there is always some reason to acquiesce. Being certain of one's beliefs ahead of time makes the difference in standing firm in obedience to the Lord. Be sure the world will mock your values. Stand in spite of their jeers. Some will lose respect for the failure to stand upon conviction and resist temptation. Future influence hangs in the balance.

The pressure to conform is as old as man. Standing fast upon conviction is not without risk. Critics will complain and may even assault the faithful physically. Conviction comes with a price. Paul wrote, "be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain.," *1 Corinthians* 15:58.

Daniel's name is synonymous with conviction. Be a Daniel in your own generation. The world will take notice.



rouble is everywhere all the time! Natural disasters, loss of property or life all invite the inevitable question, "Where is God?" Human tragedy, as in the recent shooting in Charleston, or national tragedy, as in the shocking political decisions where evil seems to be gaining the upper hand in national matters, cause some to ask, "Where is God? Why would He allow such things to happen?" May I ask in response, "Where is faith?" Our God is still on His throne. He is not weak or ineffective. He is not disinterested. He is not evil Himself, because evil is in the world.

God is not evil, nor does He engage in any form of evil. He is holy (1 Peter 1:16), and only responds from pure motives (James 1:13). God doesn't distance himself from His creation, in that He is unaware of what is happening or unavailable to care for it. Paul reminded the Colossians that all things were made through God in Christ, and that in Him all things consist, or hold together (Colossians 1:16-19). The answer to the question, "Where is God" then is, He's where he always been, in charge of all His creation.

God created humanity with free will, the ability to choose how one lives. He created us able to make decisions for ourselves, whether to serve Him or live for self, which is to live in sin. Sin comes with consequences, altering how creation functions, being cursed (Genesis 3:17-18). Paul states, "For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it, in hope" (Romans 8:20), and adds, "For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now" (8:22). Sin is the reason

our world is filled with evil and all its dreadful consequences.

Where is God? He is where He has always been, fulfilling His eternal purpose. Paul reminds us, "For what if some were without faith? Shall their want of faith make of none effect the faithfulness of God? God forbid" (Romans 3:3-4). The psalmist reminds us, "God reigns over the nations; God sits on his holy throne" (Psalm 47:8). The theme of Revelation is that God's purpose will be triumphant, no matter what humanity does. There is a day when all sin, all evil, will be dealt with in His righteousness (2 Corinthians 5:10).

What do I do in the mean time? Listen to the prophet of God to a crumbling nation:

"Remember the former things of old; for I am God, and there is no other; I am God, and there is none like me, declaring the end from the beginning and from ancient times things not yet done, saying, 'My counsel shall stand, and I will accomplish all my purpose," *Isaiah 46:9-10*.

It's easy to second guess our faith when the pressure of cultural collapse and trials mount. God reminds us, "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, declares the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts" (Isaiah 55:8-9).

The question isn't "Where is God?" as if He has departed, but whether or not we are willing to trust the sovereignty of God in this and all circumstances.

# The Battle Belongs to God Michael W. McLemore

The conflict with Goliath was more than a fight between Israel and the Philistines. For David it was the defense of the Lord's name against those skeptical of His supremacy. He believed only by the Lord's hand could a boy with a boy's weapon defeat a giant warrior like Goliath.

David showed immense courage and faith, in confronting the giant. Yet, it was righteous indignation that drove him face to face with Goliath - "For who is this uncircumcised Philistine, that he should defy the armies of the living God," 1 Samuel 17:26. David knew someone had to cast away the reproach of Israel caused by Goliath's insults. Since no one else would step forward, he volunteered to defend Jehovah's name.

Modern audiences read this account and regard it as merely a battle scene where the inexperienced underdog toppled an ancient kind of superman. We console ourselves that we will likely never contend with such a scenario. What really happened is that David stood up for God. Given how our modern culture heckles both the Father and His Son Jesus, we will surely one day find ourselves in David's sandals. Will we stand and fight to defend the scandalous attack of God's name?

One needs no degree in theology to combat those who would mock God. A few "smooth stones" of simple truth gathered from the water of life (the Bible) will do. No enemy, no matter how formidable, can stand against God's word. Whatever the outcome, the battle belongs to the Lord.
