What were they thinking? And the answer is... they weren't. Nothing is more tempting or illogical than sin. And Satan knows it. It is temporary stupidity with eternal consequences. It's not worth it and we know it. Yet we do it. We sell out for a little now when we can have so much later. By the way, the silver coins Judas received were probably sanctuary shekels. It is estimated that such coins may have been worth the current currency of 72 cents each. That makes a grand total of... \$21.60.

Judas betrayed Jesus for \$21.60. \$21.60! That's a very low price-point. Think about that the next time you're tempted to cheat on Him. So, what's your price?



The way we frame the question of security sets us up for everything from Gnostic heresy to cults to televangelists. Each one of them offers you some "secret" ranging from a hologram-type Jesus to super-salesman evangelistic programs. Each appeals to our flesh from a philosophic justification for pleasure and drugs to self-righteous satisfaction as a soul-winner to the selfish desire to get rich.

Satan is one slick adversary! He knows every trick to seduce us away from Christ. He preys on insecurities and sets us up to be destroyed. Little girls and boys are so afraid of rejection or of disappointing adults that they can be lured by sexual predators and molested. Older ones are so afraid of "not fitting in" that they will dress in ways that embarrass them, experiment with alcohol and drugs, or run the risk of a criminal record. Adults want the trappings of success so desperately that they will be ungodly in attitude, unethical in business, and untrue in relationships. The desire of the flesh, the desire of the eyes, pride in riches — Satan strikes to claim a soul from its intended place in the will of God.

The story of every selfcontained, self-centered and selfseeking life is tragic and replete with eternal consequence. One may be "king of the world," but find himself cut off from God. How sad!
