

Cling to One Another

"And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."

Hebrews 10:24-25

ebrews 10, especially verse 25, has been the subject of discussion since the day it was first read by its recipients. If one is to grasp the fullness of the writer's warning and encouragement, it is important that students not isolate the passage from the greater context. This verse is not a cudgel thrust upon the weak and fainting. It is an appeal to cling to one another, not a club.

This powerful text expresses the careful writer's anxiety for the preservation of the original faith and continuing loyalty of the Hebrew Christians. They were in danger of turning back because of doubt and the increasing heat of the fires of persecution.

In the former section two essential points have been established. First, Jesus has opened the means of passage to the presence of God by the sacrifice of His own flesh. Second, He is presently serving as High Priest in the heavenly places, or the residence of God. In view of these truths Christians are called to "draw near (to God) with confidence," 19-22. The Christian's confidence is three-fold:

CONFIDENT FAITH: The figure is that of a tabernacle with priestly functions performed inside. But, Jesus has opened the way for US "through the curtain" by "His blood" and "His flesh." Because Christ now reigns in regal sovereignty over the "house of God" as High Priest, 21, "Let US draw near" by a "new and living way." The term "new," Greek *prosphatos*, invites to mind a sacrifice, "lately slaughtered, freshly killed," recently made. That sacrifice provided for "a new and living way" where a new life was discovered by the willing adherents who now enjoy complete and permanent absolution for the guilt of sin.

CONFIDENT ACCESS: Christ opened for us a life beyond the veil, where God and Christ reside. Unlike the for-

mer life of the Jew who was shut out, in Christ all men may have access beyond the curtain — fellowship with God. This was and is not possible apart from having "our bodies washed with pure water" *cf. Exodus 29:4; Acts 2:36-41; 22:16; Galatians 3:26-27.* It is in baptism penitents are made priests, cleansed of sin and granted access.

CONFIDENT CLEANSING: In Christ "our hearts are sprinkled clean from an evil conscience" *22; cf. 1 Peter 3:21*. The point of the text is plainly that those who have confident faith concerning Jesus, submitted themselves to Him for cleansing in baptism, resulting in the remission of sins. Through His sacrifice we now enjoy access to God through the merits of His own death, not our merit.

The Hebrew writer's audience was in danger of turning back from their confession of hope in Christ. This fear is assuaged in two ways. First, God is faithful to His promises. He will keep them. The confident must remain true, 23. Second, the confident need each other — "consider how to stir up one another to love and good works" 24.

VERSE 25: It is essential that the reader note the location where "stirring one another up takes place" — the assembly. Neglecting to meet together deprives both those present and those absent. Readers are reminded that we are all prone to habit, and action will soon become routine.

Constant encouragement was necessary because of the coming "Day." Before His departure Jesus taught His disciples that the Hebrew place of worship would be destroyed, *Matthew 24*. Their Jewish world would forever change, then what? All that will remain is Christ and His promises. When trying times come, that's what we all need, Christ and His promises. If Christians turn back, what will remain for them except divine vengeance? Cling to one another, today!

TODAY AT WEATHERLY


Sunday morning Bible Study begins promptly at 9:30 am. Mike will continue his study in the book of Titus, chapter 2.
