# The Kingdom of Christ

s David made plans to build a house (temple) for God, God promised to build a house (lineage) for David, 2 Samuel 7:12-16, 1 Chronicles 17:1-10. God promised that when David's life expired He would raise up "David's seed" and establish his kingdom. Was God speaking of Solomon, or of something far more important?

When the angel told Mary she was told that her son would be called the Son of the Highest, and that He would receive the throne of his father (earthly ancestor) David, and of his Kingdom there would be no end, Luke 1:31-33. Clearly Gabriel spoke of this as "David's seed." In His lifetime Jesus taught His disciples to pray for the kingdom to come, Matthew 6:10, and in Mark 9:1, Jesus promised that the kingdom would come during the apostles' lifetime. Later in Matthew 16:18-19, He adds that the keys of the kingdom would be given to Peter.

After Christ's crucifixion and resurrection the apostles were curiously inquiring about the restoration of the Kingdom of Israel, *Acts 1:16* though Jesus had continued teaching them about the kingdom of God, *1:3*. When the day of Pentecost came, the apostles spoke to a tremendous audience by the power of God, and Peter announced that the promise of God to

David was now being fulfilled: "David... a prophet... Knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him, that of the fruit of his loins, according to the flesh, he would raise up Christ to sit on his throne...This Jesus hath God raised up...God hath made that same Jesus, whom ye have crucified, both Lord and Christ," *Acts* 2:29-36.

By this message, Peter used the keys of the Kingdom of Christ to open its doors to those who would repent and be baptized. The early Christians were in the kingdom of Christ, *Colossians 1:13*, *Revelation 1:9*, and asserted that the rule of Christ would continue until the final enemy (death) was subdued, *1 Corinthians 15:25-26*. When death is finally destroyed (at the resurrection), then Christ will deliver the kingdom over to God the Father, *1 Cor. 15:24-29*.

It is a mistake to suppose that the coming of the kingdom of Christ is a future event. The Kingdom of Christ is present! It is made up of those who have submitted to his rule in their lives. It will continue until the end of life on earth, and will be turned back to God, forever. If we are among the redeemed, we will be able to say, "We give thanks to you, Lord God Almighty, who is and who was, for you have taken your great power and begun to reign," Revelation 11:17.
