In a world full of distractions, God calls us to look to and follow His Son: "Therefore, since we also have such a great cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let's rid ourselves of every obstacle and the sin which so easily entangles us, and let's run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking only at Jesus, the originator

before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God," Hebrews 12:1-2 NASB.

Many things, important things, are worthy of the focus of our attention. But there should be one main focus: Jesus. Why? Because only Jesus provides the abundant life now and eternal life to come, John 3:16; 10:10.

God will save and give eternal life to those who focus on Jesus by placing their faith and trust in Him, Acts 16:30-31, turning from their sins in repentance, Acts 17:30-31, confessing Him before men, Romans 10:9-10, and by being baptized (immersed) into Him for the forgiveness of sins, Acts 2:38. Then, those that continue to focus on Jesus by following His Word are cleansed from sin by His blood, 1 John 1:7-9. Turn your eyes upon Jesus. Focus on Him!

Trial & Temptation

he Greek word for temptation [peirasmos] s often translated as trial or test. Trial is implicit in every temptation. This oftenquoted passage assures the believer that when one faces a trial or temptation, it will not be beyond his or her ability to endure or to escape.

How can God make that promise? Consider this. The believer will never face a trial or temptation in life that God has not "tempered." The Devil cannot willynilly twist your arm till you say, "Give!" God tempers his powers to the individual. He operates within limits. God will not allow temptations and trials to be more difficult or powerful for you to face. Whatever trial or temptation that you face in life, you can have the victory over or within through the power of the Spirit of the Lord. That promise can give us hope, no matter what difficulty we are facing in life.

James, the Lord's earthly brother, said it this way, "Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness," James 1:2-3. The word translated "trials" here is the same Greek word that was translated temptation in Paul's assurance to the Corinthians. James wanted believers to know what the response should be when expected trials come. The natural response is to complain, worry, become depressed - all negative reactions. God's commands believers to count every trial as all joy.

How? How is rejoicing in trial possible? Believers can rejoice because God permitted the trial for a reason.

"No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it," 1 Corinthians 10:13.

BETTER – Trial and is intended to increase growth and strength of every believer. He desires faith to become stronger, better. Trial is the refining fire that purifies and prepares the child of God for greater service.

BELONGING – Believers can count it joy that we are sharing in Christ's own trials. Suffering abuse for faith has been the plight of God's people from the beginning. In temptation we become part of an exclusive family. We belong -- "Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for so they persecuted the prophets who were before you," Matthew 5:11-12.

BLESSED -- When we are insulted, persecuted or lied about, Jesus said that we are blessed. We are blessed when we suffer on account of our faith in Jesus. If we are blessed, then we should rejoice and be glad. Why? Because we have a great reward in heaven for following Jesus and remaining true to Him.

BELIEVE — Facing trials is in the believer's DNA. Seeing Jesus' death, the greatest trial in human history, opens our hearts and minds to our own light affliction and of the glory to come – "For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison," 2 Corinthians 4:17. Meditating on Jesus' trial increases our faith, love and commitment to Him. It prepares believers for the trials in our future. Remember, God allows trials in our lives not to hurt but to strengthen faith. \Box
