the Gospel history we learn that Matthew, who is also named Levi, soon after he was called to be an apostle of Christ, made him a great feast in his own house, and invited many of the publicans, or taxgatherers, and others of those whom the Jews called sinners; with whom Jesus sat down to meat. His display was not well received.

Taking leave of the world in this public manner was probably intended to show, how cheerfully and with what a willing mind Matthew had resigned all its gains and its pleasures, for a better kingdom. He sought to give his friends an opportunity to know that Divine Lord to whom his future hours were to be devoted. The new disciples of Jesus hoped, too, by taking this solemn leave of his former associates, to make some salutary impression upon their minds, and in-

duce them to follow his example. But it has an effect upon the Scribes and Pharisees widely different from his charitable intentions. Disposed to justify themselves, and condemn all who differed from them, the pure doctrines of the Savior has no good effect upon their hearts. These instead engaged in observing where the honored guest departed from their own customs. They censured him for eating and drinking with publicans and sinners.

It was on this occasion that Jesus spoke as our title indicates. Hearing their censorious observations, he said to them,

"They that are whole need not a physician, but they that are sick. Go ye and learn what that meaneth, — I will have mercy and not sacrifice; for I am not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance," *Luke 5:31-32, KJV.* 

# THE END PRODUCT

ost everyone soon learns about the relationship between cause and effect, even if by another name. To the cook, for instance, it may be the relationship between the recipe and the pie. That special apple pie is the result (effect) of mixing certain ingredients in certain proportions and baking according to instructions. Only that recipe makes that pie. Even the most conscientious cook could not produce an apple pie by following a hushpuppy recipe – or, even by partly using the right recipe. Any alteration of the recipe necessarily alters the end product. The same is true with the seamstress who knows cause and effect as pattern and dress or with the builder who knows it as blueprint and house. They all well understand that personal preferences and options cannot be substituted for explicit instructions in making that pie, dress, or house. At least, we hope they understand it when we engage them to do work for us!

Accordingly, in the spiritual realm we see cause and effect in the gospel and the Christian. This important and fundamental truth is set forth in the Bible under several different figures. First, in the Parable of the Sower, *Luke 8*, the seed is identified as the word of God, *11*, which, when received into the honest and good heart, achieves its God-intended purpose. Only the pure word of God can produce that fruit-bearing child of God; that kind of character God wants in man. The sowing determines the reaping. Mixing the creeds and opinions of uninspired men with God 's pure gospel is bound to result in less than that man God wants.

In another sense, God's word is a pattern for men to live by. As Moses was admonished to "make all things according to the pattern," Hebrews 8:5, so must God 's will be the pattern for our spiritual service. All that God says about how men are to be saved, for instance, is God's pattern for saving men. That pattern includes faith, repentance, confession and baptism, Mark 16:15,16; Acts 2:38; 8:36,37; 22:16. Following this divine pattern produces saved men. Changing the pattern changes the result, just as with the recipe and the blueprint. Further, all that men can know about what pleases God in worship is found on the pages of the New Testament - and all the New Testament says on the subject comprises the divine pattern for worship, nothing more and nothing less. That pattern includes preaching, singing, praying, giving and partaking of the Lord 's Supper, Acts 20:7; Ephesians 5:19;1 Timothy 2:1,2; 1 Corinthians 16:1,2. This is God's blueprint for worship and must be followed if God is to be truly honored.

When Paul writes of the Romans being obedient to "that form of teaching whereunto ye were delivered," he pictures the gospel (teaching) as the mold or cast (tupos) into which the obedient is "poured "by submission to be shaped into a Christ-like character. Thus, following God's pattern conforms men to His Son's image, Romans 8:29 and makes them to be partakers of the divine nature, 2 Peter 1:4. The honest and good-hearted man knows that he cannot direct his own steps, Jeremiah 10:23 and so yields himself to walk by faith and in so doing becomes the fruition of God's eternal purpose, complete in Christ.

# "Honest" Able

t twenty-four years of age, Abraham Lincoln became the Postmaster of the New Salem, Illinois post office at an annual salary of \$55.70. The New Salem post office closed a few years later, but it was several years following its closure until a postal agent from Washington, DC could get to Illinois to settle accounts with ex-Postmaster Lincoln. When the agent finally arrived, Abe was a struggling lawyer having difficulty making a living by the practice of law. The postal agent informed Lincoln that he owed the Federal Government \$17.00. Abe walked across the room to an old chest where he unwrapped a yellowed rag tied up with string in which he had kept the money he owed the government. "I never use anyone's money but my own," he told the federal agent. He had kept this money for years, and could likely have lied about having it - and gotten away with it. That was in 1836. It would be 24 years later when Mr. Lincoln would take the oath of office to "preserve, protect, and defend the Constitution of the United States" and thereby become the President and Chief law enforcement officer of the United States of America. Such episodes in this great man's life earned him the appellation, "Honest

This story offers a glimpse into the character of those who lived in the past. Sadly, our nation misses such noble men of character and integrity.
