Your life means more than you realize. Family, neighbors, friends, and coworkers need to see faith lived. They need to witness faith in action. The child of God should "Live Faith Out Loud!"

Jesus declared the Gospel of the Kingdom then modeled it for the world to see. His lifemodel abides to the present. It's no accident that He began with the "Be-attitudes," a sort of preamble to the Gospel, then said, "You are the salt of the earth... You are the light of the world," *Matthew* 4 — "Live the Gospel out loud!"

Wouldn't you agree that with all that is happening in our world at large, on social media, in our city, neighborhoods and workplaces, now, more than ever, people need to SEE and HEAR the power of God demonstrated in the lives of the faithful? People need to see the hope that is in the Gospel message of salvation embodied in the real lives of real people of faith. Christians need to encourage one another to run the race and finish well. We should be examples to all and worship the Lord in spirit and truth, with all our hearts. As we live faith out loud we will experience revival in own our hearts and be an encouragement to others.

Focusing on Jesus and living out loud for Him, others cannot help but notice. They will see what true joy and spiritual revival look like. Perhaps even more profound will be the evidence of the change forgiveness brings to the life and the emotional wellbeing of real people.

People need to be encouraged. They need to know others are praying for them. They need to see and feel that they are loved and not forgotten. They need to know that they are loved by God. They need to understand that He wants them to know His grace, love and peace. They will see that first when we live our faith out loud!

LIVES WORTHY OF THE COSPEL

"Only let your manner of life be worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that whether I come and see you or am absent, I may hear of you that you are standing firm in one spirit, with one

mind striving side by side for the faith of the gospel, and not frightened in anything by your opponents. This is a clear sign to them of their destruction, but of your salvation, and that from God. For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should not only believe in him but also suffer for his sake, engaged in the same conflict that you saw I had and now hear that I still have.

Philippians 1:27-30

ome tend to accept the premise that "if only this or that weren't in our way, the church would be better or more effective." Paul countered this baseless philosophy with the true need of God's people in every age, "Only let your manner of life be worthy of the gospel," *Philippians 1:27*.

The term "worthy" from the Greek *axios*, means "appropriate after a godly sort." What is our duty? Live lives worthy of the Gospel. When life is hard, live lives worthy of the Gospel. When the money is tight, live lives worthy of the Gospel. When workers are few, live lives worthy of the Gospel. When people are uncooperative, live lives worthy of the Gospel. When you are under threat of life, live lives worthy of the Gospel. You get the picture?

In Pauls' own attempt to advance the gospel, though embroiled with adverse circumstances and attacks from both without and within, he both lives his life worthy of the Gospel and pleads for this spirit among brethren. Read Philippians 1:27-30 to the side and note three considerations are observed in the text.

SHARED PERSEVERANCE — "I

may hear of you that you are standing firm in one spirit, with one mind striving side by side for the faith of the gospel," 27. The family of God is called to "stand firm" against every device and inducement of the Devil, as Spartan warriors shoulder to shoulder in battle, "for the faith."

UNITED COURAGE — "And not frightened in anything by your opponents," 28. Together they could resist the forces arrayed against them, whether from outside or inside the church. Their courage would send a signal of defeat into the ranks of the opposition.

MUTUAL SUFFERING — "For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should not only believe in him but also suffer for his sake," *29-30.* Paul calls upon the church to mimic his willingness to suffer for the gospel, bringing glory to him in their flesh.

The greatest blessing of fellowship is standing together in one spirit and uniting around one purpose. It requires God's people to resist selffocus and to recognize the beauty of God's plan to unite many different people in Christ to advance the faith of the gospel.
